"Ineffectual"? Reeve A. MacArthur took exception to board references in the decision to her testimony being "ineffectual" maintaining she had been specific in emphasizing the township didn't need another quarry when six quarries already exist within three miles. "The only people who need it is Campbellville Gra-

Solicitor David Thompson, in his report to the township, told members the case did revolve around "reasonable need" and the Board had based their interpretation on the availability of the market and willingness of the owner to proceed.

No permit yet

Reeve MacArthur pointed out the OMB decision did not mean Toronto Centred Region Plan, she could see no reason why a quarry would be allowed to proceed on the fringe of the

Niagara Escarpment. Deputy Reeve Don McMillan observed the problem of quarries had been "batted around for 13 years". He called for a three point attack on the program, first by defining the big quarries from the small ones. Then, he suggested the three major

problems attached to quarries should be separated and dealt with. He spelled out the first problem as trucks and the road maintenance and construction problems attached; the second problem as blasting and the possibility of provincial supervision or co-operation with other municipalities in making seismographic equipment available; and the third problem, environmental. He suggested the need for assurances the end of the quarry would leave it for conservation or other attractive

### Policy didn't work

The deputy reeve maintained there was a need for change in the township approach because its busic policies hadn't worked effectively.

Councillor C. MacIntyre suggested he had always felt a proper agreement drawn up between the individual quarries and the township would be far more effective than by-laws and the need for costly prosecution.

Members agreed the by-law committee should study current township and provincial legislation on quarries and the meeting with the provincial member and Minister of Mines should be arranged.
