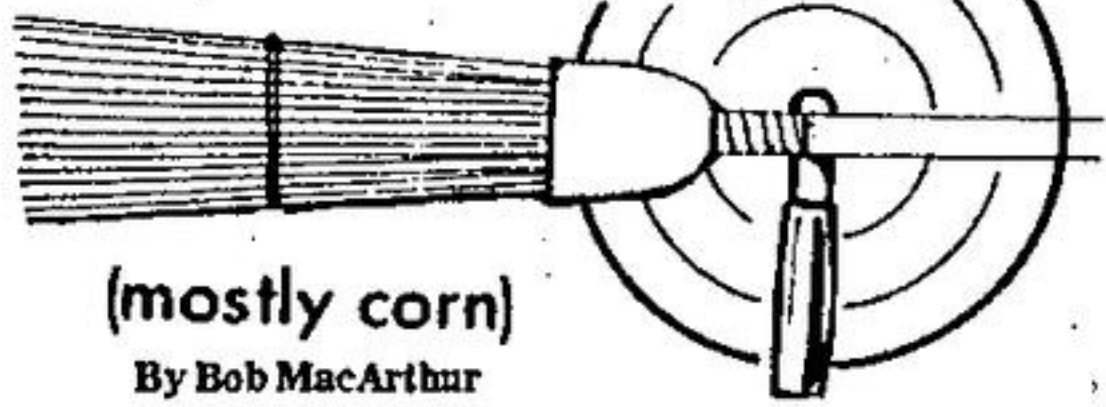


# Wi' Rock and Broom
