- To delete the provisions giving votes over and above the number provided for under The Municipal Act to the Reeves and Deputy-Reeves of municipalities within the County based upon the number of electors in the municipality which they represent;
- To substitute for the deleted provisions, provisions giving additional representation over and above that provided for under The Municipal Act to municipalities within the County based upon the number of electors up to 40,000 in the various municipalities;
- To provide for appointing the additional representatives by by-law of the Council of each municipality entitled to additional representation;
- To provide that the Mayor of a municipality may be substituted for the Reeve or Deputy-Reeve as the municipality's representative on the County Council;
- To delete the provisions which prevent the total votes of the representatives of the Towns of Burlington and Oakville on the County Council from exceeding the votes of the representatives of the other municipalities represented thereon.

Councillors at ACRO review "guidelines"

Five Halton County Councillors attended the Association of Counties and Regions of Ontario mid-term meeting in Toronto last week, when the ACRO "Guidelines for Action 1970" were reviewed.

Guidelines is a special report on local government re-organization in Ontario which ACRO had prepared in 1970. Another committee has brought in a series of amendments and it was these amendments which delegates to last week's mid-term meet reviewed. Final recommendations will go to the annual conference in Sarnia next October.

Warden F. G. Oakes of Acton, Reeve Ron Harris of Milton, Reeve Arthur Speight of Georgetown, Reeve Allan Masson of Oakville and Deputy Reeve Don McMillan of Nassagaweya attended from Halton. Membership in ACRO includes all counties and regions (except Niagara) and the record attendance of 226 delegates represented every member.

Signs of the times
