Lad drowns
 Milton's first drowning in 14 years claimed the life of two-year-old Dale Thring last Wednesday evening. His parents are Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Thring of Fulton St., Milton and his grandparents are Mr. and Mrs. Oliver Thring of Acton and Mr. and Mrs. Jack Charlton of Milton. He disappeared from the fenced rear yard of his home shortly after 5 p.m. Searchers located his body about a mile down the muddy Sixteen Mile Creek almost 14 hours later following an all-night search by an estimated 75 volunteers. A ball he had been playing with was found several yards downstream. It is assumed he climbed a chain link fence surrounding his yard or squirmed under it at one corner.
