Festival winners staged a concert for parents at Milton District High School auditorium on Thursday evening and a full house crowd attended to hear the best of the festival participants repeat their winning numbers. Adding to the program were a variety of other musical and gymnastic presentations by students from North Halton schools.

Winning choirs from M. Z. Bennett School in Acton, Brookville School in Nassagaweya, W. I. Dick and Martin St. Schools in Milton and Speyside School in Esquesing performed once more on Thursday. An intermediate choir from Percy Merry school, North Oakville was also scheduled to sing, but many of the singers were away at a science fair project and the choir was unable to perform.

Thomas Gibson, principal of Martin St. School in Milton and president of North Halton Music Festival Association, chaired the 90 minute program. He reminded the large audience that the participants were the best of 1,500 students who sang at Wednesday's competitions.

Bennett School, Acton, who had produced the winning design for this year's festival programs. Dick students, vocal solos by Linda Smith and Bonnie Hill of Martin St., an instrumental group from J. M. Denyes School Milton, and the school band from Martin St. School.
