Mr. Ken Graham has been busy mowing the corner cemetery.

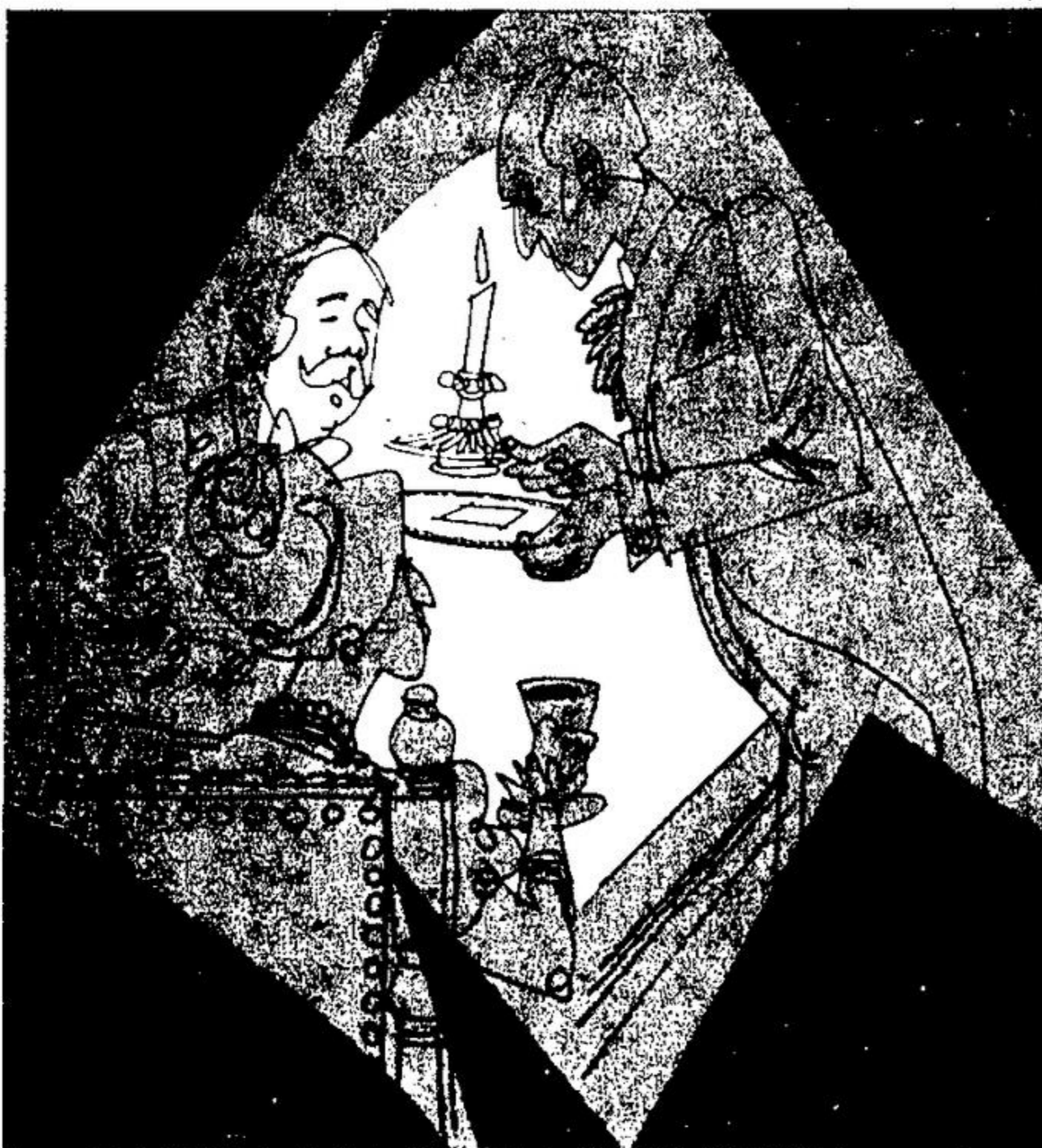
Census school

returning Sunday. The stress this time was on the "Camp-Out". Gordon is one of our Ballinafad high school students.



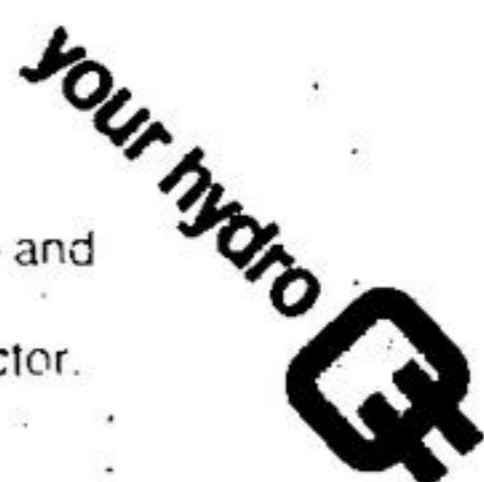
