

# Phil Morris, Maureen Gerth Halton-Peel track champions

Middle distance runner Phil Morris and 14 year old Maureen Gerth won individual championships for Acton District High School at the first annual Halton-Peel Secondary Schools track and field meet in Etobicoke last week.

Morris earned the right to compete in the OFSSAA meet at the C.N.E. Stadium in Toronto this weekend, when he won the senior boys' 800 metres in a time of 2:00 7/10 and placed second behind Bill Maandag of Oakville Perdue in the senior boys' 1600 metres. Phil's time in the 1600 was 4:27.

Long toss Miss Gerth tossed the shot putt 9.69 metres, approximately 32 feet, to place first in the midget girls' shot putt. Since there is no provincial meet for girls, last week's was the final of the high school year for Maureen. However, ADHS coach Bruce Andrews hopes to make arrangements for her to compete in open meets this summer.

Shirley Mitchell won a third place ribbon for her toss of 8.74 metres in the senior girls' shot putt and Roger McEachern placed fifth in the midget boys' long jump with a mark of 5.25 metres, 17 feet six inches. Roger also competed in the midget boys' 400 metres.

## Summer Festival set for June 26

Arena manager Harold Townsley is completing arrangements this week for Acton Parks and Recreation Committee's "Summer Festival '71", to be held in the community centre on June 26.

White Oaks Ceramics, north of Acton, are busy producing 1,500 beer mugs, which will be used as admission tokens the night of the festival. Mugs may be purchased on advance sale for \$2 each. Price the night of the festival will be \$2.50.

Dancing music will be provided by two bands, one a rock group, and the other a German band. The floor of the community centre has been licensed for 1,000 persons from 6 p.m. until 1 a.m. A staff of 50 volunteers has been engaged to work the night of the festival.

Funds raised will be used to purchase playground equipment for Acton's parks. Cuts requested by town council resulted in an overall reduction of \$9,000 in this year's parks and recreation budget.

The committee hopes to realize a profit of \$2,000.

Part of the funds will also be used for renovations to the arena. Mugs will be available shortly at the arena booth. Those who don't wish to pick up mugs immediately can reserve them by picking up a ticket at the booth.
