## Blame lightning for fire

Lightning is blamed for starting a fire at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Toebes, at the corner of Main St. and Knox Ave. last Thursday at noon. Firefighters quickly had the blaze under control and confined flames to the attic.

Damage was also confined to the attic area but some water damage is reported to floor coverings in the upstairs bedrooms.

The fire was discovered when Marienes "Pop" Schuts visited his daughter's home looking for his wife. He saw smoke coming out of the eaves and dashed inside to warn the Toebes family. Then he grabbed a pail of water and upstairs to the bedrooms in an attempt to quell the fire. However, he found no flames—or smoke.

Meanwhile his daughter, turned in the alarm and two fire trucks made the short journey from the fire hall at Bower and Willow, generating considerable excitement and attracting many on lookers despite the wet tail-end of a thunderstorm which drenched the ground.

Firefighters opened the attic from outside to get at flames. It was their second call in two days.

## Ask three way stop at collision scene

Esquesing Council has promised prompt action on a request from residents of Milton Heights for a three way stop and caution lights at the intersection of the Esquesing-Nassagaweya town line and Three Sideroad, scene of the serious car-jump truck collision Friday, which injured 12 persons, including 16 children.

Jack Zanatta presented a petition, signed by residents of both sides of the roads, to council Monday night. The petition also asked for installation of street lights and the posting of limit signs for residential areas.

**Three ways**  
Residents are asking that stop signs be erected on Three Sideroad coming east and west and on the town line coming south. A small hill is located on the town line coming north.

"There are stop signs now on Three Sideroad, but you have to pull almost out into the middle of the intersection to see cars coming south on the town line," Mr. Zanatta told this paper.

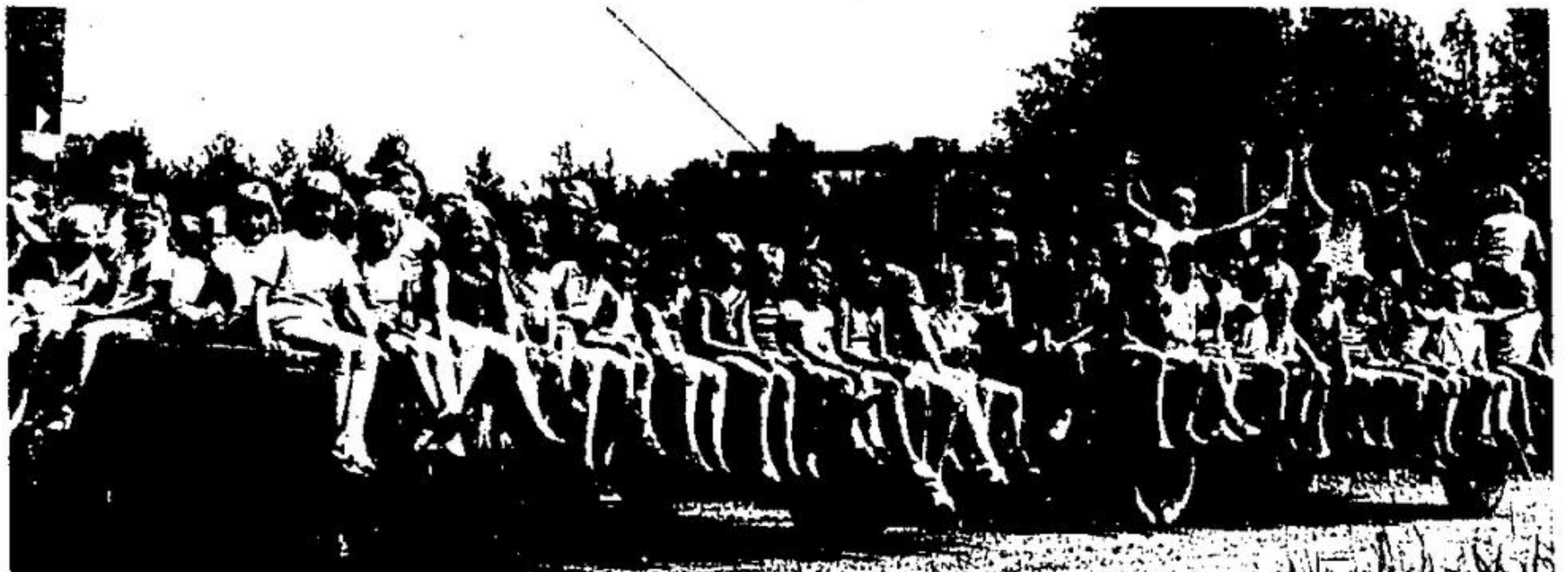
**Heavy traffic**

## ACTON COUNCIL BRIEFS

On Tuesday council:

- Declared Monday, August 2 Civic Holiday and issued the necessary proclamation.
- Rescinded a motion accepting a tender of Armstrong Construction to scarify, reshape and resurface Churchill Rd. N. at a cost of \$5,095 and passed a second resolution accepting the tender of Royal Paving to do the necessary work at a tender price of \$4,247.67.
- Approved the holding of a tag day by the Duke of Devonshire chapter of the I.O.D.E. during the fall fair.
- Granted permission to the regional assessment office to provide a reproduction of the assessment roll to the public and separate school boards at their expense.
- Had no objections to the application of Helen Zeravlev and Edwin Jennings to the committee of adjustment for land separations.
- Objected to the application to the committee of adjustment from Joseph Zosip and Vinko Cavlovic. Their application requested a side yard setback reduction from five feet to two feet to allow the replacement of a single car garage with a double car garage on their property at 163 Tyler Ave.
- Paid accounts totalling \$15,659.17 and special accounts totalling \$6,143.90.
- Agreed to accept a pro rata payment on an estate account.
- Set the dates of the August meetings of council at August 17 and 31, and committee meetings on August 9 and 10.
- Reeve Oakes reported a county committee had apparently achieved an acceptable reorganization of the representation on county council.
- Mayor Duby said he was asking for a meeting with O.H.C. to find out how accommodation is going to be allocated in the senior citizens and geared to income housing. He said he wanted to make sure some of the early applications are not overlooked and wanted to be sure all who had applied are on an O.H.C. list.
