Begin construction soon Knox church addition

Construction will begin within a month on a \$50,000 extension to Knox Presbyterian church. The addition will provide a second entrance to the existing Dr. A. C. Stewart Memorial Hall from Knox Avenue and will contain a foyer and four large multi-purpose rooms. The decision to accept the tender of the Herrensberger firm of Campbellville was made at a special congregational meeting held following divine worship last Sunday.

Funds available
The need for additional facilities was felt strongly by a number of members during the fifties, particularly those involved in the Christian education program of the church, and this led to the creation of a Building Fund in January 1956, to which many members have contributed through the years. A number of legacies left to the congregation by deceased members and others have been carefully inventoried, and apart from certain amounts which have been used for major repairs to the existing structure, such as the re-leading of the stained glass windows and the overhaul of the Woodstock pipe organ, are available, along with the Building Fund, to completely cover the cost of the new addition.

Third contract
This will be the third building contract entered into by the congregation during the ministry of the Rev. Andrew H. McKenzie who was inducted as minister on September 6, 1956. In the spring of 1967, when it was discovered that some structural weaknesses in the roof and walls threatened the building, the firm of Len Ariss of Guelph was hastily called in. The roof trusses were reinforced, and the walls which had been going outwards at the top were brought back into "plumb" by the use of steel rods. This vital reinforcement and repair cost the congregation approximately \$8,000. In 1965 a major renovation of the basement and the section of the building on the second floor

adjacent to balcony was undertaken. Again the contractor was Len Ariss. The exterior basement walls were carefully underpinned and deepened, and the whole basement area was both enlarged and deepened when 28 inches of soil was removed and new reinforced concrete floor laid. Added at this time were washrooms in the lower area, and a beautiful, fully equipped kitchen was provided adjacent to the hall, which was named at this time the Dr. A. C. Stewart Memorial Hall in memory of a beloved minister of congregation, 1921-1939.

Committee
The Building Committee that has prepared the plans for the new addition to be erected is headed by Robert Paul. Members of the committee are Clarence Coles, Bill Mainprize, Doug Mason, Calvin McIntyre, Murray Skoyne, Murray Smith, and the minister, ex-officio. The architect is the well-known Port Credit architect, Donald Skinner, who also drew plans for Acton's library, hydro-electric building and the addition to the M.Z. Bennett School.
