Norval school
Reed offers Lawson cool
The decision to leave Norval School is a source of joy for the people of Norval and Julian Reed and his group of Norval and District Ratepayers. However Reed and his cohorts are not ready to let the matter die a natural death. Several months ago Reed, accompanied by a handful of Norval Ratepayers, protested the envisaged closing of the Norval School. After due consideration the board announced the school would remain open. At a recent school board meeting Norval school was again the topic of discussion. In a letter Mr. Reed begged the board to take immediate action to provide a kindergarten for the handful this year. The board plans to bus the 12 registered kindergarten students to Pineview school. Reed claims that while only 12 kindergarten students are registered several parents are keeping their children home to avoid letting them travel the buses. In his letter Reed offers what must be a unique sort of an arrangement. Acknowledging the lack of capital funding of the board Reed offered community help. Let us help "How about letting us provide the accommodation, and you simply provide the teacher and normal basic equipment? We could consider structure at a later date when funding might be more available," he suggested. "Have you also considered relocating a now empty portable? Church basements have been offered. I am sure these hastily assembled thoughts can be greatly improved upon. It is hoped they might provide some food for thought among the board members," the letter read. Because the letter was received only two days prior to the board meeting an investigation into the allegations had not been made. Director Jim Singleton told the board. Do they know costs? "I'm not sure they know the cost of building schools. He said he had no evidence to substantiate Reed's claim that children were being kept home because they would have to travel by bus for kindergarten. Mr. Singleton said an investigation would be made to determine how many children are affected. "We are able to make staff adjustments in September and move staff to pressure points if we have to," he said. The results of the investigation are expected at the August meeting of the board. Lawson cool to plan Esquimes trustee Bill Lawson said statements attributed to Mr. Reed in a daily paper were entirely false. "If this man is saying things like this it is about time he was corrected," Lawson said. "According to the press Reed said it takes two and a half hours bus time for three hours school. That's only a 20 minute ride." "It says here Reed won his first victory when the board allowed his son to go into grade one without attending kindergarten after a lengthy dispute. I don't recall this ever coming to the board. This was either settled by the principal or the administration people in the North Education Centre," Lawson continued. All false The press report indicated Reed had won a subsequent battle with the board when the board over-ruled the administration's recommendation to close the school. Lawson said the board had not over-ruled the administration but had supported their recommendation to have the school left open. "Someone is mistaken here. It is either Reed or the paper. I think it would be a serious mistake for the board to enter into this sort of a situation," Mr. Lawson said, referring to Reed's latest proposal.

Water is needed for plant growth

Plants must be watered regularly - not according to a timetable but whenever the soil is dry. A light sprinkling every night will only encourage shallow rooting and subsequent drought damage. Give the garden a good soaking to a six to 10 inch depth. Plants in shade require less watering than those in the sun. Fast growing plants require more water since plants absorb all their food in liquid form. After pruning, plants can be kept drier than usual. Water when new growth develops.
