Single car accident

Four teenagers injured

An Acton area youth was taken to Hamilton General Hospital Thursday morning as a result of serious head injuries he sustained in a single-car accident on the Nassagawya-Esquesing town line south of 17 Slideroad Wednesday evening. The other three teens in the car at the time of the accident were also injured,

and two have been transferred to other hospitals while one remains in satisfactory condition in Milton District Hospital.

Larry Hill, 19, of R.R. 1, Acton was transferred from Milton Hospital to Hamilton General as a result of the injuries he sustained. In satisfactory condition in Milton Hospital is 18-year-old Raymond Cutting of R.R. 4, Rockwood, driver of the car. He suffered a fractured nose, chest injuries and a fractured left ankle.

Transferred to Guelph General Hospital suffering from a sore left ankle and right shoulder was Lynne MacDonald, 17, also of R.R. 4, Rockwood and 17-year-old Kimberley Black of R.R. 4, Rockwood was taken to Joseph Brant Hospital in Burlington suffering from a lacerated left eye, fractured right elbow, multiple fractures of the lower left leg and unknown chest injuries.

No change speed limit

So far as Esquesing council is concerned the speed limit on No. 7 highway to the western entrance to Georgetown will remain as it is unless the Department of Transport requests a change.

Council received a letter from the town of Georgetown's solicitors noting the town had a survey made on the strip of highway between Main St. N. and the western town limits but later found out all but two or three feet of the road was in the township.

It was suggested, that Esquesing might be interested in enforcing the recommendations the town received from the Department of Transport which included a 35 mile per hour limit on that stretch of road.

Councillors generally were unsympathetic to the suggestion with the deputy-reeve remarking that it took long enough to travel through Georgetown now without prolonging the trip. Speed limit is now 50 m.p.h. but it will soon change to 60 m.p.h.

Superintendent of county jail

Two car crash

Three die near Ballinafad

A two car crash at the corner of the Seventh Line and 5 Slideroad, Erin township, Saturday evening took the lives of an Orangeville man and his 10 year-old daughter and an Erin youth in the second car died Sunday morning of injuries received in the accident.

Dead are Russell Stephens, 40, and his daughter Christine, 16, of Orangeville, and 16 year-old Sean Richardson of Erin, lone occupant of the second car. In hospital in satisfactory condition are Mrs. Stephens and two younger children, Paul and Valerie.

Both cars were almost total wrecks. Constable Kuipers of the Guelph OPP detachment investigated the accident. Dr. Walter A. Scott pronounced Mr. Stephens and Christine dead at the scene.

Sean Richardson was taken to Guelph General Hospital with severe head injuries and later transferred to Kitchener Waterloo Hospital where he died. The funeral was in Erin Tuesday. It was the third accident of the past week on the Seventh line, near Ballinafad.

Urges preservation Silvercreek park

Esquesing council indicated they were very much interested in preserving the pie-shaped piece of roadside parkland at the Silvercreek curve as a park, following receipt of a letter from well known resident S. G. Bennett.

"It always was a nice park," remarked deputy-reeve Russ Miller, sitting as acting reeve, in the absence of Tom Hill. Councillor Dick Howitt said several people on planning board were receptive to the idea of keeping the land as a park and he was, too. And Councillor Coxie thought the park would be used more by local people now that the entrances were off the highway. He felt it would be a good investment for the township to keep it as such.

Renouting of the Silvercreek curve on highway 7 during recent highway construction has made the park accessible only from County Road 3 as it goes to Ballinafad. Picnic tables and shade trees on the wedge-shaped piece of property have made it popular with motorists.

Creek will flow again

"The whole area's going to be brought into an acceptable condition very quickly," Mayor Les Duby assured members of council last night (Tuesday).

The mayor was referring to the school creek and land surrounding the Acton Centennial Library, which were described recently by Councillor Norm Elliott as "a bloody eyesore". Mayor Duby reported he had looked at the area with engineers, the town superintendent and representatives of the Halton County Board of Education Monday and that steps will definitely be taken to slope the banks of the creek and to increase its depth to ensure a steady flow of water.

The town has agreed to split costs on the improvements with the board.

Cyclist hurt in collision

Riding a motorcycle, Rod Ewing of Georgetown escaped with lacerations and abrasions after he collided with a truck on Highway 24 at Strattons Corners. The collision happened Monday morning. The youth was taken to Guelph General Hospital where he was released after treatment.
