South's opening bld is routine. North has a choice of bids. However, when one bid will describe a hand better than another, you should make the most descriptive bid. A jump raise of a major suit opening shows good trump support and 13-15 points.

ToaT

Since this describes North's hand to a T, this is the best bid to make. I imagine that many pairs would miss slam because North bid spades first and then could not describe his hand afterwards.

East's bid did more harm than good. South has heard his partner make a jump bid. Now East has shown some strength in spades. South can realize that there is no duplication in spades and bids the slam with confidence.

13 tricks If you really want to try you can make 13 tricks on the hand. Most declarers settled for the obvious twelve tricks - five hearts, four diamonds, two clubs and one ruff in dummy.
