"Fire Can Break your Heart"is the apt theme for the 1971 celebration of the nation-wide Fire Prevention Week. It was just 100 years ago, on Oct. 9, 1871, that the Great Chicago Fire almost totally destroyed the entire city and each year Fire Prevention Week is celebrated in the week surrounding Oct. 9.
