Georgetown to get GO trains

Premier Bill Davis announced that GO transit rail services will be introduced into Georgetown, Brampton, Bramalea, Malton and Weston, possibly by late 1972.

The premier made the announcement just prior to the election, noting he intended to start negotiations with the Canadian National Railway. The GO transit service utilizes commuter trains on CN lines and is operated by the provincial government with the co-operation of the railway.
