O.P.P. report

Winter hints for motorists

Officers of the Acton Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police investigated 11 general occurrences, during the reporting week of October 31 to November 7.

Of the occurrences investigated a total of four resulted in charges being laid. There were two motor vehicles recovered after having been reported stolen. One of the vehicles recovered had been stolen from a local residence. Two juveniles were charged with 'Arson' after investigation revealed that a fire at an east end plaza was started deliberately. There was one break and enter during the reporting week. A local chicken had been entered via a broken window, however nothing appeared to have been stolen. Two local men were charged with 'Having liquor in a place other than residence' after being checked by an officer. The remainder of the occurrences were of a minor nature and required little investigation.

Two accidents
There were two reportable motor vehicle collisions during the week. One of the mis-haps resulted in a Milton man being charged with 'Impaired Driving'. The other collision was caused by a driver backing his car out of a private drive, into the path of another vehicle. The driver at fault was charged with 'Failing to Yield'. Total damage resulting from the two collisions was estimated at \$1,200. There were no injuries.

Clean windows
The highway Traffic Act of Ontario has provisions making it an offence to drive when the windows of your car cannot afford clear visibility. With the cold weather now prevailing, car windows become steamed up and covered with condensation more frequently. Make sure your car windows are clear before you set the vehicle in motion.

Motorists, Remember! The of Acton has a by-law presently in force, regulating the amount of time a vehicle can be parked on a town street, between the hours of twelve midnight and seven A.M. The by-law states that no vehicle shall be parked on any town street between these hours for more

period. Remember to make sure your car is not left on the street overnight.

Erin township council

At the regular meeting, Erin Township council:

—Received notice of approval of the new fire hall building from the Department of Labor.

—Passed a motion to forward the requested sum of \$250 to the Ballinacree Community Centre for debts incurred during alterations required to pass fire inspection.

—Received a bill for \$26 from the Department of Labor for looking at plans for the new fire hall.

—Passed a motion to pay the 1971 levy of \$3191.25 from the Grand River Conservation Authority.

—Learned that a rabies clinic will be held in the township again this year.

—Received a letter from Ontario Hydro informing council that they are ready to proceed with appraisal and purchase of a 610 foot right-of-way through the south of the township. It was mentioned that this right of way would "work in pretty well between Lots 2 and 3, all the way across."

—Discussed a request from the village trustees to prohibit the parking of inoperable cars in Hillsburgh, and in this way cut down the number of old cars lying around.

—Received a letter from the Wellington County School Board asking for suggestions concerning school programs, for expanding school facilities.

—Received a letter from Roy McConnell advising them of his offer to sell 30 acres, including the Mill pond, known as the Howe property to the Credit Valley Conservation Authority for \$35,000 and asking their support. Reeve Lloyd Lang thought that council should support the purchase and development of the property, commenting "It has terrific potential". Council passed the requested resolution.

—Declined a request from a township resident for a wire fence bonus. The requisites are in part, that the fence (on a township road) be as near as possible to the boundary, that the rubbish and brush be cleared away, that the posts be of steel or sound cedar, that they be planted at least three feet deep and no more than 20 feet apart, and the fencing be eight or nine strands and new. Road superintendent Ed Bardon said the fence in question had supports more than 20 feet apart.

Scale Wall
