## Sabres sharp in league debut slaughter Shelburne Sunday

When a team scores 19 goals and shuts out the opposition 10-0 in the third period, it usually calls for a celebration. But Acton Sabre coach Bill Dawkins wasn't nearly as jubilant about his club's easy 19-4 win over a shorthanded Shelburne team here Sunday, as he was about their fine showing in a 4-2 loss to Alliston Hornets Friday night. Friday's game was the South Central O.H.A. Junior "D" league opener.

Although they'd only been able to work out on Acton ice twice prior to Friday's game, the first year Sabres showed definite signs of promise. In fact, a number of observers, including several Allistonians, felt the Acton club had much the better of the play. Shots on goal were even 24-24. Sabres simply failed to cash in on their scoring chances.

Craig Weldon was outstanding in goal and the Sabre defence corps belted Hornet forwards with authority. Neither team scored in the first period. Alliston outscored Acton 3-1 in the second frame and each team scored once in the third.

Meanwhile Sabre sharpshooters had a scoring field day at the visitors' expense. The line of Ray Evans, Pete Morrison and Bill Field accounted for 11 of the 19 Acton goals and totalled 27 scoring points.

Evans, a Milton juvenile product, led the way with four goals and seven assists. Morrison tallied five goals and two assists and Field counted two goals and seven assists.

Gary Turkoz grabbed the team lead in goals, by bagging four to go with the pair he notched in Alliston. George McPhail potted a pair of goals and Charlie Gidden and Ted Harmer added singles. Randy Weldon drew four assists, Dale Fisher picked up three, Ted Harmer two and George McPhail, Charlie Gidden, John Sheppard and Brian Davey one apiece.
