### ESQUEESING Township Council HIGHLIGHTS

At their regular meeting Monday night, Esqueesing Council:

—Passed a by-law authorizing the reeve and clerk to sign a new dog control agreement with George Herrington.

—Passed a by-law authorizing the reeve and clerk to sign a new fire protection agreement with the town of Georgetown for Esqueesing fire area number one.

—Passed a by-law authorizing the reeve and clerk to sign a property purchase agreement between the township and the County of Halton for a piece of property in Stewarttown.

—Approved for payment part of the township's Halton County Separate School Board levy in the amount of \$6,500.

—Authorized issue of \$250 to the Ballinafad Community Hall Board to pay for maintenance costs.

—Received notice from the Department of Municipal Affairs of the upcoming incentive winter works program. The township used a total of \$8,428.61 in provincial funds during last year's program.

—Received a letter from the Georgetown District Memorial Hospital Board asking that a representative be allowed to attend a future council meeting to give a progress report on the hospital's expansion program.

—Reeve Tom Hill presided for the 2½ hour meeting with all councillors present.

### Four accidents - DUBY car crumpled

But the expected short trip took a lot longer, when the DUBY car was involved in a collision at the corner of Peel and Acton Blvd. at 7:55 a.m. An obliging neighbor took Alice DUBY home to change. Damage to the DUBY car was estimated at \$500; one side was crumpled. She was driving west on Peel St. The other car driving on Acton Blvd. to the high school,

was driven by Liberal Paiva of Brampton. His car had estimated \$125 damage. He was on his way to work at the high school.

A fire, believed to have been caused by an overheated engine, resulted in an estimated \$300 damage to a car owned by Terry McMullen of Acton early Tuesday morning.  
 Acton Firefighters were called

to the scene on Highway 7 just east of town about 12:15 a.m. There were no injuries.
