Abnormal wind fatality cause

Halton County Construction Safety Officer Norm Guthrie reported the industrial fatality at Eden Glen Apartments two weeks ago was caused by an abnormal gust of wind. The wind ripped through the seventh floor and lifted a section of reinforcing mesh and steel joints into the air and carried the materials for a distance of 50 feet - killing one workman and injuring six others.

Emilio Buccioli of Weston died as a result of the incident. In his report Mr. Guthrie noted the wind gust was an extremely low probability occurrence and indicated all reasonable precautions were taken.

He along with Mr. Draycott from the Ontario Department of Labour and Milton Police Department investigated the accident. The accident occurred Nov. 2 shortly before 11 a.m.

According to Mr. Guthrie's report a crane operator just inhaled being hit by the flying materials. No inquest has been ordered in connection with the incident.
