TB targets

Most people think of tuberculosis as a disease that attacks only the lungs. But almost any part of the body may be affected.

Tuberculosis can appear in the intestines, kidneys, rectum or lymph glands. Other targets are the bones and joints, observed most often in children and young adults. TB of the bones and joints was much more common before milk was pasteurized.

Germs can travel, via the blood stream, to the bones, joints and spine and can grow and spread because of low body resistance.
