ENTERTAINMENT

One of the reasons advanced by historians for the downfall of the Roman Empire was the over-indulgence, on the part of the masses, in "bread and circuses", i.e. the over-feeding of the physical body with food and drink and the over-stuffing of the intellect with interest in activities of an entertainment nature. All this, to the exclusion of the

pursuit of more important things. On the other hand, the ideals advanced by the followers of the Christian Way have been credited with preserving, in large measure, the continuance and stability of law and order as built

up by Rome in earlier years. The writer of this article recognizes the need in the life of physical recreation and of pleasurable intertainment of the mind. "All work and no play makes Jack a dull boy"; not only a dull boy, but also a very nonsociable one. One of the safetyvalves of human life is provided by way of interest in something other than the day-by-day ac tivities in which the average person has to engage to earn a during meeting living. Without such a safetyvalve the individual may experience a mental breakdown of the worst kind and, since "the mind stands with one foot on the body", physical decline may also

result It is a good thing to have an interest in something other than

just earning a living. With all this in mind, it is wise for us to ask ourselves to to where our outside interests should lie and as to what extent they should cause us to become involved. If our daily occupation is mainly of a manual or physical nature, then we should show some interest in things that demand involvement of the intellect.

If the vocation that is ours is, for the most part, one which demands the application, in an intense way, of the powers of the mind, then relaxation may be found in physical exercise. At the end of the day, tiredness of body should be balanced by tiredness of mind. Thus may we find rest as we retire, and rest brings refreshment to both body and

At the present time, the magnifying of the importance of sports and entertainment has created the tragedy of almost universal professionalisation of both. The result is that, in two years of professional hockey, a "super-star", like Bobby Orr, can earn more than the person who has rendered devoted service to mankind, is able to

acquire in a life-time. Surely the Shakespearian expression applies here - "the times are out of joint". Of course, the fault lies ultimately with the one who pays his way into the place where the sportsman shows off his talent.

Baha'u'llah lived in an age in which kings had ultimate control of the destinies of their subjects In most instances, through lack of inspired leadership, they had permitted their countries to fall into moral decline, resulting in endless wars and civil strife. Although Baha'u'llah, because of his religious conviction and influence for moral reform, was imprisoned by the Muslim rulers, he audaciously sent letters from his prison cell to almost all the the leading rulers of that day, urging them to improve morals and functioning of the government; the end of increasing armament, establishment of equal justice for all classes, and immediate consideration of the suffering of the ruler's impover-

ished and exploited subjects. The author's style is brisk and carries one easily to the falling of six kingdoms, and the founding, teachings and development of the Baha'i Faith, an independent world religion, which has now spread to every country and territory of the globe.

The members of this faith will have this new book on display at a meeting on Human Rights Day at which time they will be showing the CBS movie "And His Name Shall Be One". This will be held at the Scout Hall the evening of December 10.
