The guest speaker for the evening was Allan Orr, a young farmer in the community who spoke convincingly on enthusiasm and participation; "What ever you want to do, get in there, and do it!"

Then came the highlight of the evening for the 4-H members who worked so hard all year to complete their 4-H projects, the presentation of awards!

**Breed awards**

Don Nicholson of the Agricultural Office presented the Breed Association Awards to the members. These breed awards are presented by the various cattle breed associations, Holstein, Guernsey, Shorthorn, Hereford, Aberdeen Angus and Charolais to members who

exhibited their breed of calf. In this manner the Breed Associations encourage young people to look into the merits of their breed. The United Breeders Inc. also presented awards to calf club members with hopes of encouraging use of artificial insemination.

Trophies donated by the United Co-operatives of Ontario Erin branch for members with highest points in each section were awarded to the following: beef, John McKinnon, dairy, Jim Reid, grain, Ron Reid, corn, Kevin Lang.

**New trophy**

A new trophy this year Forage donated by the Erin Agricultural Society for highest points in the forage club went to Frances McLean. One of the most coveted awards is that donated by the 4-H club leaders. This trophy is given to the junior member who has shown deserving work. This year's winner was Marie McKinnon.

One of the most interesting awards presented was the Interclub Judging Competition

Trophy which has come to a team from Erin Township 13 times since the trophy's conception in 1921. Donald Matheson whose name appears on the trophy numerous times outlined the history of this large trophy and awarded it to this year's team consisting of John and Marie McKinnon, Frances McLean, Beryl McGill and Kevin Lang. This trophy is livestock judging and evaluation.

Also presented was the Inter Field Crop Judging Trophy won by this township with team members being Jim Reid, Kevin Lang and Wayne Parkinson.

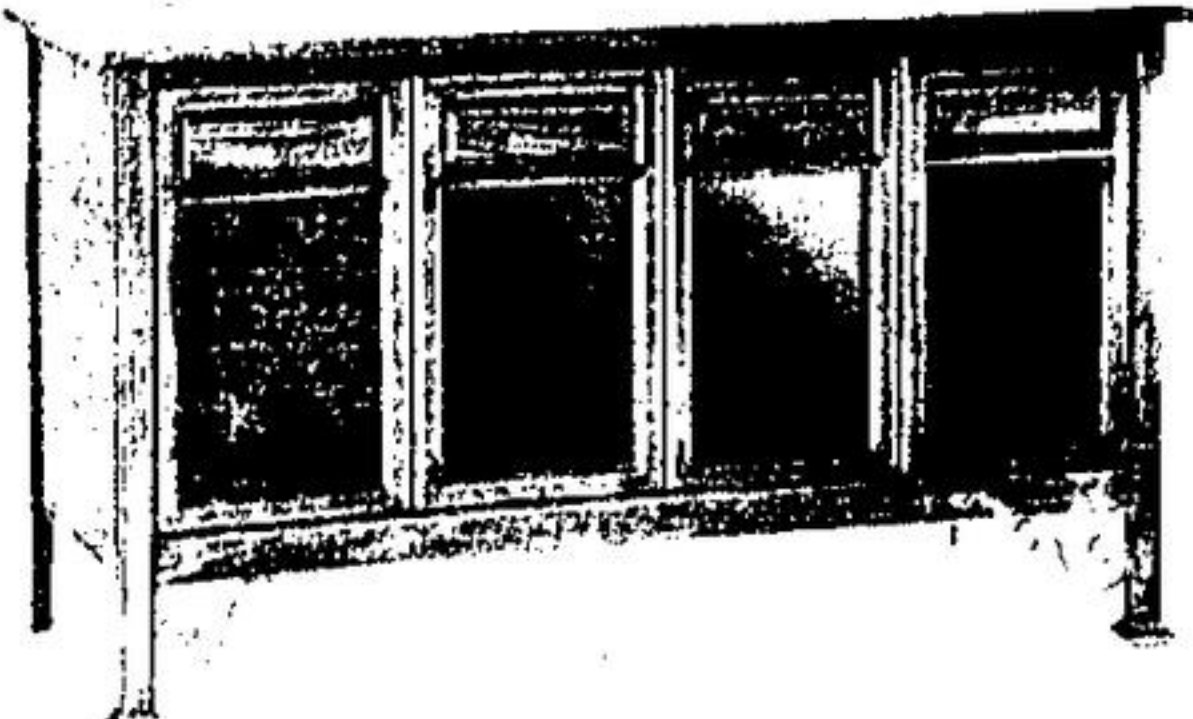
