Cut one loaf of bread in to small pieces, and let it dry for three hours. Put in one tablespoon of sage, one cup pop corn (unpopped) and one tablespoon of saffron. Stir all these ingredients together. Add three chopped onions browned in 1/2 pound of butter.

Add one tablespoon of salt, one teaspoon of pepper and one tln of sliced mushrooms. Add a pinch of garlic powder. Mix all together. Stuff dressing in turkey and sew up. Put in preheated oven at 350 degrees. You will know the turkey is done when the pop corn blows the derriere of the turkey. I have not tested this recipe, so I can't guarantee success.
