Postpone

Esqueing Council has postponed reappointment of members to planning board and committee of adjustment and representatives to conservation authorities, normally carried out at the first regular meeting of the new year, until a later meeting. At Monday's opening meeting, Deputy-reeve Russell Miller expressed the opinion members should not necessarily be re-appointed automatically with no consideration of their past record. Miller said he would like to check meeting attendance records.

Unfair
Councillor Len Cox felt it was unfair to ask the same people to serve year after year, even though they may have served very well in the past.

"Other people should be given a chance," he said. "It might be wise for us to look into this further, advertise and see who might be interested in serving," he suggested.

Clerk-treasurer Delmar French thought council might even consider reducing the number of members serving on planning board.

Opposed
Reeve Tom Hill was opposed to new appointments to planning board or committee of adjustment at the present time, because the township's official plan is still up in the air.

IT'S 1972 now.

THIS is Leap Year. February has 29 days.

NEW snowmaking cannons are in use now at Glen Eden ski area. First snow was made Dec. 23.

YOUNGSTERS have been wearing their new snowmobile suits to school. Great for grappling in the snow.

PLENTY of people and some stores, too, are reluctant to part with their attractive Christmas decorations.

ONE young boy had so many gifts to show his teacher he had to lug them to school in a plastic garbage bag, almost as big as he was.

TWO older women, who shared a taxi downtown Monday, discovered to their consternation nothing was open—not the post office, the banks or the stores.

TB has been controlled but the drop in incidence is not automatic; it is the result of continued pressure which has to be kept up. TB germs have not changed. They are as virulent as ever. There are fewer cases of TB today because a nation-wide vigilance is maintained. There's more to do. Halton County Christmas Seals donations are still being accepted.
