## Obituary

# Charlie Thomson dies in B.C.

Word was received Monday by the Free Press that 1969 Acton Citizen of the Year Charles J. Thomson died at his home, 908 Clark Rd., Port Moody, British Columbia on Sunday, January 2, 1972.

No further details were available at press time. Charlie Thomson was a dedicated minor sports worker, a great favorite with the youth in town. His work with minor hockey and baseball and with girls' softball were responsible for a groundswell of opinion that resulted in his selection as Citizen of the Year.

## Newton F. Hurst lifelong resident

A lifelong resident of Acton, Newton Francis Hurst died suddenly at his home, 285 Peel St., on Christmas Day. Mr. Hurst had suffered from heart trouble for a number of years.

An employee of the Hydro Electric Commission for 20 years, he had been meter reader and then as his health failed he remained in the office as bookkeeper.

Mr. Hurst was born in Acton October 27, 1910, son of the late Sarah McClure and Newton F. Hurst. He attended schools here. He served in the Army overseas from 1942 to 1946, and was a member of Acton branch of the Canadian Legion.

He is survived by his wife the former Beattie Vickers; son Newton; sisters Adelaide Wylie, Rockwood; Vera Frowe, Bobcaygeon and Frances Hurst, Richmond Hill, and a brother Joseph Hurst, Acton.

## Former pastor dies in Guelph

Former pastor of St. Joseph's Church, Acton, Rev. Father F. J. McReavy died in Guelph on Friday, December 31, in his 84th year.

Father McReavy was pastor in Acton from 1922 until 1929, succeeding Father Goodrow and being followed by Rev. J. L. McBride. He was transferred from Acton to Paris where he was pastor of Sacred Heart parish there until his retirement.

## Alex Bessey funeral Dec. 22

A retired farmer, Alex Bessey of Hillsburg died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Guelph, December 20. He had been in failing health for the past three years.

Funeral service was Dec. 22 at Butcher's funeral home, Hillsburg, with temporary entombment at Coningsby vault to be followed by interment in Hillsburg cemetery in the spring. Pallbearers were Hillsburg neighbors and the lower bearings nephews Ross Bessey, Belwood; Brian Bessey, Guelph; Glen Near, Arthur and William Bessey, Cayuga.

Mr. Bessey was born in 1900 in Erin township, son of Ellen Grey and Leonard Bessey. He and Pearl Near were married at the bride's home in 1924, and she predeceased him. They moved from the third line of Erin, where they farmed for 36 years, to Hillsburg 11 years ago.

Surviving are daughter Erma (Mrs. Gordon Fines), Orange; granddaughter Darlene and grandson Larry Fines; brothers William and Ewart, Guelph and Arnold, Erin. A brother Wesley predeceased him.
