### Waste management

## Want county-wide study

Providing provincial subsidies are available and the cost is not excessive, Halton County Council will engage consultants to study prospects of a county-wide solid waste management program for Halton.

Burlington and Oakville have engaged a consultant who is in the preliminary phases for a study in those two towns. Minister of the Environment George Kerr recommended that the study be made for the whole county.

The study is estimated to cost \$50,000 for the two southern towns or \$60,000 for the whole county. While Kerr hasn't given a direct answer about the availability of subsidies for the study, he indicated there would be a stronger argument for one if it was done on a county basis rather than individually.

The administration committee of Halton County Council agreed to seek a definite answer on costs and on subsidies.

At the suggestion of Warden Jim Swanborough the committee recommended the formation of a committee including the administration committee members and one staff representative from each of the municipalities. The warden suggested he would not support the study if grants were not available.

Esqueing Deputy Reeve Russ Miller suggested some municipalities may not need new facilities at this time but he felt it would be helpful to have a county-wide picture. He recalled his municipality being forced to provide a study on the Esqueing township dump at a cost of \$2,800.

Reserve judgment Nassagaweya Reeve Mrs. A. MacArthur supported the committee's move to seek information regarding subsidies and a firm price for the county, but reserved judgment concerning the final go-ahead for the study.

"We won't need it in Nassagaweya for a good long time but it would be good to take a look at the problem on a county-wide basis," she said.

## Planning students study Nassagaweya

Approximately 15 students of the Urban Planning Course of the University of Waterloo will be working on a part time basis for the Nassagaweya Planning Board from now until about the end of March.

At the Jan. 18 meeting of Nassagaweya Council, Councillor James Watson mentioned the planning board had been in contact with the professor of the course. Members of the planning board recently met with some of the students to plan the outline of the program.

"The students will conduct surveys on the needs of the township, what buildings are needed, the need for shopping centres, what the township residents want for their future — basic fundamental planning," Watson explained to the council. Watson also mentioned the students had been given all the information on the township's requirements. The work the students carry out will compose a portion of their spring term mark, and will be carried out in class time, explained the councillor. He also mentioned that the students would meet with the planning board at their business meetings, to keep the board up to date on their progress.

"The professor of the program has agreed to work within a budget of \$500," explained Watson. "From a planning viewpoint this will be quite an asset for Nassagaweya," he concluded.
