Problem: planning
Nassagaweya Reeve Mrs. A. MacArthur cautioned members of the administration committee of Halton County Council about any thought they may have about proceeding with an official plan for the county.
The outspoken reeve told her colleagues they should wait until the province has finally made up its mind about planning. She traced the succession of studies and plans made by the province and the Toronto-Centred Region Plan for Development.
Grave implications
"The Toronto-Centred Region has grave implications for Nassagaweya," she said. The reeve recalled the province issuing an ultimatum to the township. "They told us if we didn't develop an official plan they'd do it for us. Everyone got up tight and we spent more than \$12,000 on one and they are still doing our planning for us. The province should be finished planning for us," she told the committee.
Committee Chairman Allan Masson suggested official plans were being continually changed and he said the nature of planning prevented the province from saying they were finished. He suggested it was an ongoing thing that couldn't simply be stopped.

Election talk on agenda Tory meet
The annual meeting is the reason for the get-together, but the hint of a federal election will likely be the main topic when Halton (federal) and Halton East (provincial) Progressive Conservative Association meets Thursday at Trafalgar Hall in Oakville.

Several other candidates are rumored to be in the race but none have confirmed it yet.
