### Judge James Black well known in area

A former mayor of Oakville, Judge James Robinson Black died Friday night at Oakville Trafalgar Memorial Hospital. A private funeral service was held Monday.

In his youth he also played hockey in Oakville. A past president of the Oakville Canadian Legion, Judge Black served overseas during the second world war, and was awarded an MBE. He served four years as mayor of Oakville from 1962 to 1966 and as town councillor before that. He had served as a Justice of the Peace.

He is survived by his wife Isabel Hewson, a daughter Elizabeth (Mrs. John Lloyd) of Oakville, a son John of Oakville and a sister Miss Elizabeth Black of Dublin.
