George Currie, addressing the 125 assembled counselled future councils to "pay your way. You can't run a municipality or the Dominion of Canada on deficits." He also suggested to aspiring and elected politicians that if you intend to stay in politics "serve the people you represent. Make an honest effort and they'll forget a few mistakes", he urged. The "dean" of county representatives said if he reminisced "we'd be here all night" so he expressed his thanks simply for the testimonial.
