BY-LAW NUMBER 72-14
A By-law to regulate the parking of unattended motor vehicles in the Town of Acton.

WHEREAS the Council is empowered by the provisions of Section 363 (8) of the Municipal Act R.S.O. Chapter 284 to pass by-laws in respect to unattended motor vehicles;

NOW, THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Town of Acton enacts as follows:-

1. That no person driving or in charge of a motor vehicle, other than a commercial motor vehicle, shall allow such motor vehicle to stand unattended on any street, roadway or municipally operated parking lot in the Town of Acton, unless it is locked in such a manner as to prevent its operation by any person not authorized by the owner, driver or person in charge.

2. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this By-law is guilty of an offence and on summary conviction is liable to a fine of not less than \$1.00 and not more than \$10.00.

READ A FIRST, SECOND and THIRD time and finally passed this 11th day of April, 1972.
