**No price hike**

There will be no rise in the cost of entry into conservation areas operated by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority during the 1972 season.

Parking will remain at \$1.50 per car; camping, \$1.50 per night per camping unit; bus entry fee, \$10 and season parking fee, \$15.

Conservation Areas at Terra Cotta, Belfountain and Monora will be open to the public on May 19 for the holiday weekend. Meadowvale, Limehouse and Orangeville Reservoir Conservation Areas are under development and further notice will be given when these areas are open to the public.

**Plant trees**

Tree planting in the Credit Valley got into full swing last week with the onset of spring weather. The Scouts made a valiant effort on April 22 but were finally rained out about 11 a.m. They completed their project of planting 25,000 trees in forest conservation areas on Saturday, April 29.

Staff of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority are planting 60,000 trees for private landowners and 650 large trees in park areas this year.

At an average of 1,000 trees per acre, another 100 acres of the Credit River Valley will be planted this year.

Over the past 10 years the Authority has planted some three million trees in the valley.
