Coach John Goy Jr. and manager Gus Holmes have been supervising midget workouts for the past two weeks.

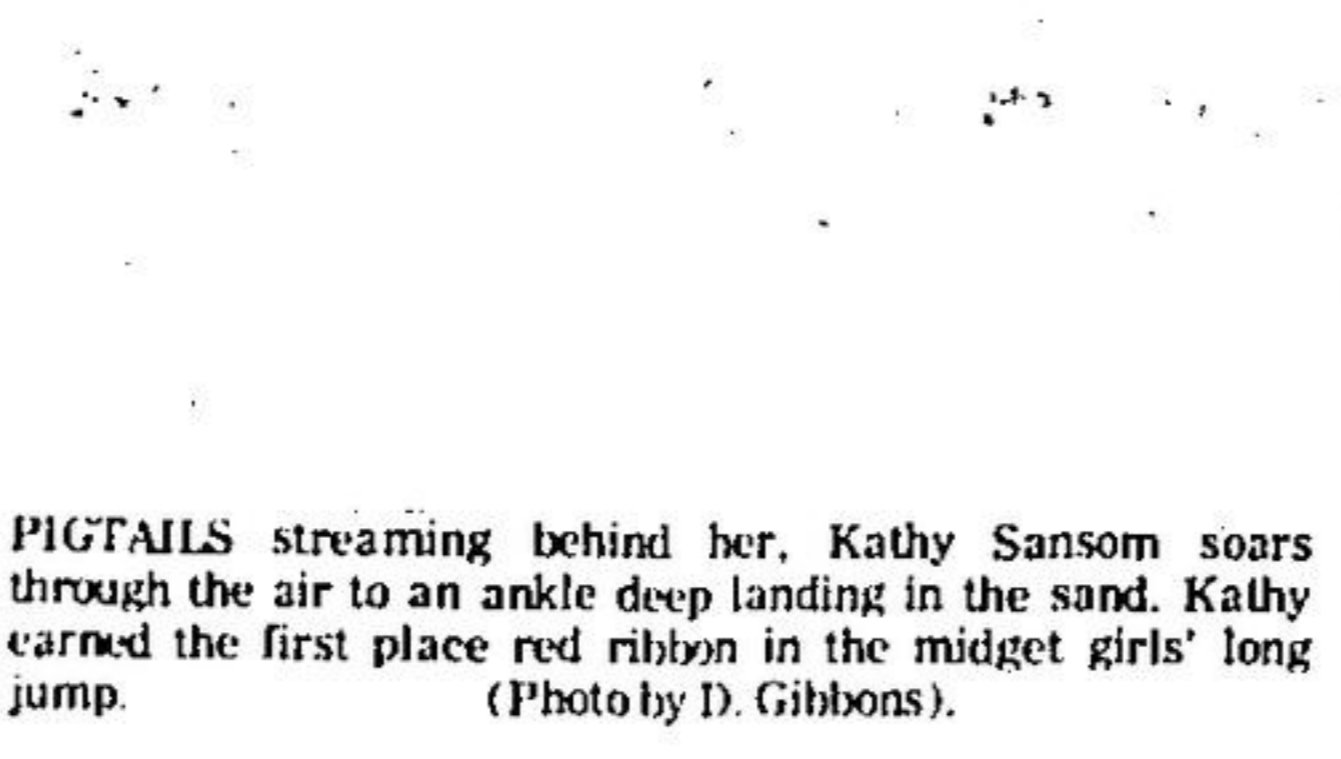
Players from last season's bantam team, which won the Oakville House league championship, form the nucleus of the midget squad.
