Esquesing council approved a request for a building permit on a 75 acre farm at Speyside although there is an existing

house on the property. Council told Lloyd Sankey who appeared at the regular meeting Monday night that as long as the existing house was used for a hired hand there was no violation of the agricultural holding bylaw. Mr. Sankey explained he wanted to build a house off 17 Sideroad on the Oisen farm at Lot 17, Con. 3, and retain the present stone house for hired help off Highway 25.

His offer to purchase the property was conditional on the granting of a building permit.

"As long as you understand that 17 Sideroad is an unopened road and it is your problem to keep it open, there is nothing to stop you," the reeve declared after hearing Mr. Sankey's story. Councillor Len Coxe agreed.
