

# Council approves second house on farm

Espeaking council approved a request for a building permit on a 75 acre farm at Speyside although there is an existing house on the property.

Council told Lloyd Sankey who appeared at the regular meeting Monday night that as long as the existing house was used for a hired hand there was no violation of the agricultural holding by-law. Mr. Sankey explained he wanted to build a house off 17 Sideroad on the Olsen farm at Lot 17, Con. 3, and retain the present stone house for hired help off Highway 25.

His offer to purchase the property was conditional on the granting of a building permit.

"As long as you understand that 17 Sideroad is an unopened road and it is your problem to keep it open, there is nothing to stop you," the reeve declared after hearing Mr. Sankey's story. Councillor Len Coxe agreed.

It was pointed out during the discussion that there would be no separation involved and Mr.

Sankey intended to farm the 75 acres.

**No dance hall**

Although the Sankeys received approval for their project, Joseph LeBlanc's request to add to a barn on his property at Lot 15, Con. 7, 15 Sideroad, was not so successful. Council decided to send the request to committee for further consideration.

Reeve Tom Hill thought there was no way to stop Mr. LeBlanc from adding to the 16x19 structure presently on the lot but Councillors Dick Howitt, Len Coxe and deputy reeve Russ Miller were not convinced side-yard requirements in the holding by-law were not being violated.

Mr. LeBlanc told council the addition was to give his horse more room as well as adding storage for feed. Smiling, he told council he had no intention of making it into a dance hall, in reference to an alleged infraction of the holding by-law by a local association. The new structure would be movable.
