Object of the boost is easier starting and longer plug life with the possibility of cutting down on pollution. The design of the "Post-Start" system is completely Canadian, as is the Argo machine which was at ease on the sand hills alongside the northwestern shore of Fairy Lake. Ask for briefs on Niagara Escarpment

A series of six public meetings will be held this summer by an Ontario Government Task Force set up to recommend Provincial land acquisition and development policies for the Niagara Escarpment.

The first meeting is scheduled at the Milton District High School on Wednesday, June 14, beginning at 7:30 p.m. Other meetings are being arranged in Hamilton, St. Catharines, Orangeville, Collingwood and Owen Sound.

The Task Force will report to the Cabinet by October 1. Local authorities, organizations and individuals are invited to submit verbal presentations, briefs and letters to the Task Force.

Provincial Treasurer Darcy McKeough said the Government "wants to proceed as quickly as possible to implement further policies for the conservation and public use of the Niagara Escarpment."

Develop priorities "We have asked the Task Force to develop priorities to be used in the acquisition of lands by the Province and to advise on proposed land acquisitions."

"We have also asked for land-use and development standards, recommendations on land-use control methods and advice on all proposals which would result in major changes in existing land-use patterns."

The provincial treasurer added that the Government wants to ensure that all groups and

organizations interested in the future of the Escarpment have an opportunity to advise the Task Force on what they think should be done to achieve these goals. Your old age pension and supplement
Those who are receiving maximum benefits under the combined Old Age Security and Guaranteed Income Supplement will be entitled to \$150 for a single person or a married person whose

husband or wife is not a pensioner and \$285 for a married couple where both are pensioners—\$142.50 each.

Those who are now receiving a **partial supplement** will also receive the same amount of adjustment, but not the new maximum benefits noted above.

Your **May cheque** will not include the increase.
Your **June cheque** will be at the new rate and will also include the back payments to last January.

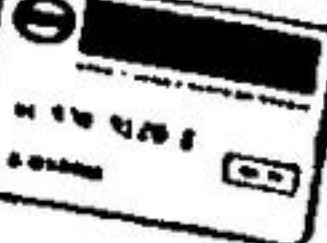

TOWN OF ACTON NOTICE

The Municipal Council of the Town of Acton will, after the expiration of one month from the date of this notice, take into consideration and pass a By-law to stop up and close that portion of Elizabeth Drive in the Town of Acton more particularly described as follows:

All and Singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Town of Acton in the County of Halton and Province of Ontario and being composed of part of Elizabeth Drive in the said Town of Acton as shown on Registered Plan Number 603 on file in the Registry Office for the said County of Halton, containing by admeasurement 0.085 acres be the same more or less and which said parcel of land is more particularly described as follows:

PREMISING that Blackham Street in the said Town of Acton has a bearing of North 43 degrees — 58'-40" West and relating all bearings herein thereto:

COMMENCING at the point of intersection of the northeast limit of Blackham Street with the northwest limit of Elizabeth Drive in the said Town of Acton, said point of intersection being also the southwest angle of Lot 191 as shown on Registered Plan Number 1098 on file in the Registry Office for the said County:

THENCE North 51 degrees — 03'-00" East, along the said northwest limit of Elizabeth Drive being also the southeast limit of said Lot 191, 411.36 feet more or less to an angle therein:

THENCE North 15 degrees — 51'-00" East, along the said northwest limit of Elizabeth Drive being also the said southeast limit of said Lot 191, 115.75 feet to a point therein:

THENCE Southerly, along a curve to the left having a radius of 66 feet an arc distance of 31.10 feet for a chord equivalent of 30.81 feet on a chord bearing of South 2 degrees — 21'-00" West to a point of reverse curvature:

THENCE Southerly, along a curve to the right having a radius of 81.58 feet an arc distance of 42.94 feet for a chord equivalent of 42.45 feet on a chord bearing of South 3 degrees — 55'-45" West to a point of tangency:

THENCE South 19 degrees — 00'-30" West, along a tangent to the aforesaid curve, 45.57 feet to a point:

THENCE South 52 degrees — 40'-30" West, 418.47 feet more or less to the point of commencement.
