North Halton libraries benefit from grants

Acton, Milton and Georgetown public libraries benefit from grants received by the newly formed Esqueusing Library Board.

Acton library will receive \$567.60, Milton will get \$632.40 and Georgetown \$1263.60 as the result of a resolution passed at the regular meeting of the township board Tuesday, May 30. The grants were received from the Ministry of Colleges and Universities.

Library facilities, resources and services in Acton, Milton and

Georgetown are available to all township residents free of charge. Esqueusing library board was formed in 1971. Ruth Wilson is chairman.

The board is also a member of the South Central Regional Library system, which entitles residents access to any member library in the regional system.

Latest figures indicate Acton has 261 Esqueusing adults and 212 children users. Georgetown figures are 610 adults and 443 children. In Milton the count is 133 adults and 349 children.
