High rural registration for Legion hockey

Acton Legion Minor Hockey Association provided hockey for 270 boys, highest registration in its history, chairman Kerwin McPhail reported at the committee's recent annual meeting.

Of the 270 boys playing house league hockey here, 125 were from surrounding municipalities including Rockwood, and Ermaison, Erin, Nassagaweya and Esqueving townships.

The organization's expenses for the season were in excess of \$4000, including a total expenditure of \$1522.50 for ice rental.

Registration fees produced an income of \$2100 and the committee was able to meet remaining expenses with funds raised at their annual peewee tournament and the Niff. Old-timers - Acton Sabres hockey game. Both events were huge successes, thanks to the hard work and cooperation of participants and Legion members and excellent fan support.

Expenses higher
Mr. McPhail anticipated that with an expected increase in teams next year and the \$1 hike in ice rental rates, recently announced by the Acton Parks and Recreation Committee, the association's expenses will be even higher. The association had six novice teams for the first time this season and two more teams and one more bantam team are expected to be added next year.

Treasurer Gord McCutcheon estimated the organization's cost to be somewhere in the neighborhood of \$12 per boy. Registration fee of \$7.50 included a hockey sweater, which each boy was allowed to keep at the end of the season.

Crests given
For the first time all participants received crests. Increased registration necessitated the staging of two windup banquets, also for the first time.

Mr. McPhail cited the cooperation of Branch 197 in supplying facilities for special events, the volunteer work done by coaches, managers, convenors and referees and the realistic stand on ice rental rates taken by the parks board as major aids to the minor hockey program over the years.

The association is planning a fund raising dance for the Legion auditorium, Saturday, October 21.
