Items of Interest

Police seize drugs, girlie mags

Georgetown police stopped a car on Guelph St. there recently and it led to a raid by O.P.P. and RCMP officers on an Esqueving township house, where drug charges were laid.

The chain of events began when police found one of the passengers in the car in possession of an ounce of hashish, worth about \$240. He was charged and turned over to the RCMP at Kitchener.

Hours later seven RCMP officers, with assistance from North Halton OPP, raided the Esqueving house and seized five ounces of hashish and two ounces of marijuana.

Meanwhile a Hornby home was searched in a separate incident and 421 girlie magazines, 271 paperback books, seven films and other novelties found. A Hornby man was sentenced to three months in jail on a charge of circulating obscene material. The same man, who operates a mail order distributing business, previously had been convicted three times in the last two years on the same offence.

Three dairy princess contestants

Two drivers injured in accidents in area

A single car accident Saturday resulted in minor injuries to the driver, Neil Robertson of R.R. 5 Milton, report Milton OPP.

The accident occurred on the Third Line of Esqueving, south of the 15 Sideroad. Estimated damage to the Robertson vehicle was \$600.

Driver hurt

One thousand and fifty dollars' damage was done to vehicles operated by Clive Brown of R.R. 1 Acton and Michael McDonald of Norval when they were involved in a collision on Highway 25, south of Acton on Saturday. Brown received minor injuries as a result of the accident.

Milton OPP report 14 collisions involving 21 vehicles occurred in the North Halton area patrolled by the department, from June 11 to June 17.

Ten people were injured as a result of the accidents and total property damage was estimated to exceed \$7,000.

Police contact change needed

Mayor Les Duby told council last week he has received calls from residents who are not particularly satisfied with the system of calling a Zenith number to contact the police.

He said that although he supported the Zenith system previously, he now recognizes an area of elderly people who are not able to handle the system and thus feel a bit insecure.

The mayor thought perhaps people need an exact number to call, instead of having their message recorded and listened to by police when they complete their patrols of the town.

Under the present system calls to the Zenith number are relayed directly to the cruiser.
