



# Whipped by Warlocks Rams wallop Midland

League leading Windsor Warlocks breezed to an easy 22-5 Junior "C" lacrosse victory over Acton Rams in the border city Sunday afternoon, a loss Rams winless Midland Hurons 20-6 in a lacklustre game at the community centre Monday night.

Confusion about the starting time of Sunday's game forced Rams to take the floor in Windsor after a long bus trip and only a brief warmup. According to Acton's copy of the schedule, the game was set for 7.30 p.m., but when the team arrived in Windsor at 4, O.L.A. officials ordered them to dress immediately claiming the game was supposed to start at 2 p.m.

Warlocks, benefitting from the coaching of Jim Bishop proteges outclassed Rams in every period, enjoying 7-2, 6-1 and 9-2 period advantages in goals scored.

**Midgets good**  
Two of the better Acton performers were Kevin Marcoux and George Artem, who were recalled for the game from the Rotary midget club.

Mike Marcoux scored three goals for the Rams. George McPhail and Grant Haines shot singles. Thirteen different players shared in the Windsor scoring. Marty Young and Greg Ducharme fired hat tricks to lead the scoring parade.

In a complete reversal of form, Rams romped to their ninth consecutive victory over the hapless Midland Hurons here Monday night.

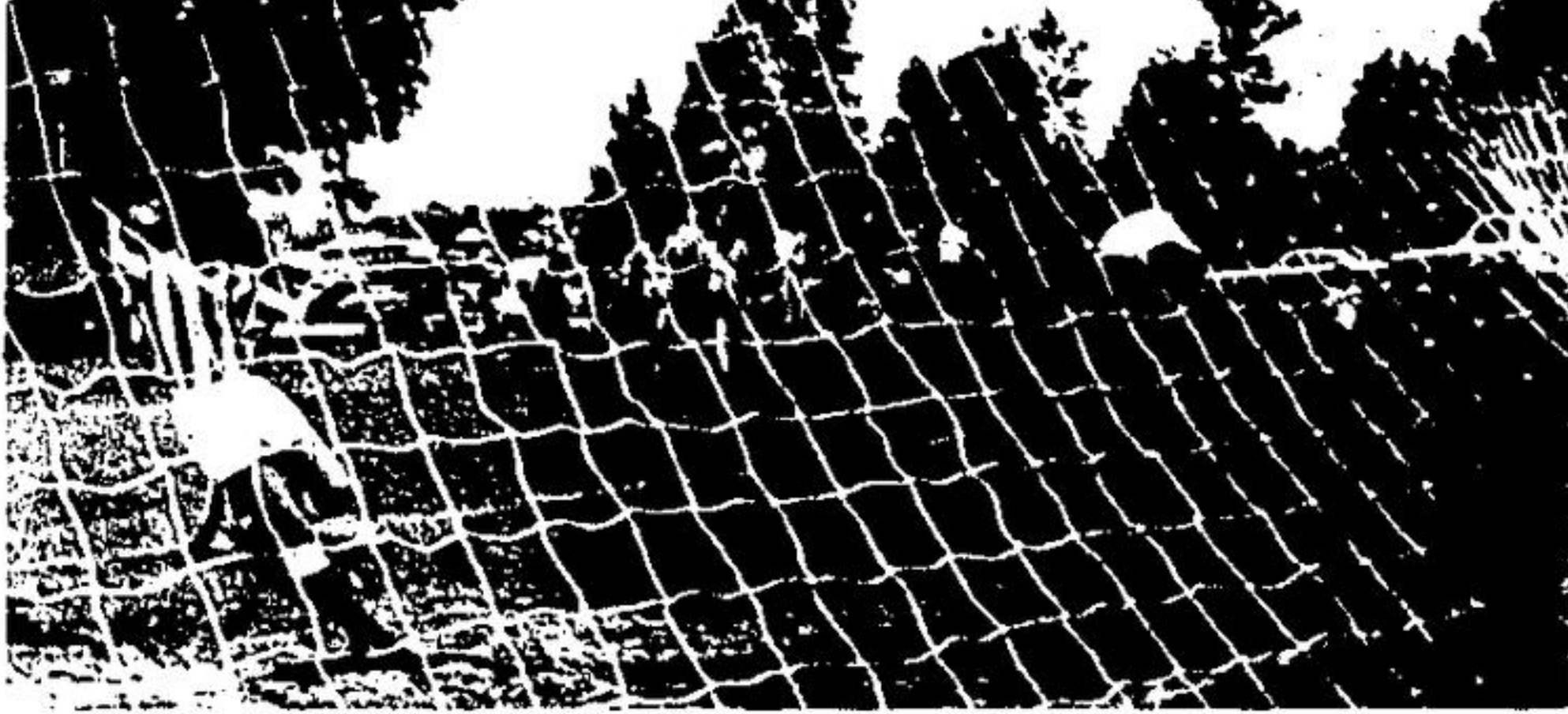
Nine different players, including goalie Gary Turkosz fired shots past Midland goalies Dave Clow and Mike Bannon. Rams built up a 7-3 first period lead and increased it to 13-3 at the end of the second period.

**Well-done**  
Craig Weldon had one of his best games ever in a Ram uniform, scoring four goals and assisting on five others. Grant Haines also scored four times, Mike Marcoux and George McPhail netted hat tricks, Dale Fisher bagged a brace and Gary Turkosz, Dave Manes, Stu McCulloch and Harry Barenis tallied a goal apiece.

Ted Warzecha and Brian Cooke, who normally plays goal, each scored twice for Midland.

Rams are now faced with the serious problem of finding replacements for Turkosz, Fisher and Randy Weldon, who leave this weekend for a summer trip to Western Canada. Manager Alan Hall signed Mike Cooper Monday night and he's now looking for a goalie to replace Turkosz.

Rams play a return game in Midland tonight (Wednesday) and take on Bolton in a home and away series next week. The teams play here, Monday, July 3 and back in Bolton, Wednesday, July 5.
