ough's triple and a sacrifice fly and two more in the seventh, when Eric Lacey walked and Andrews circled the bases as Mota muffed up his bunt.

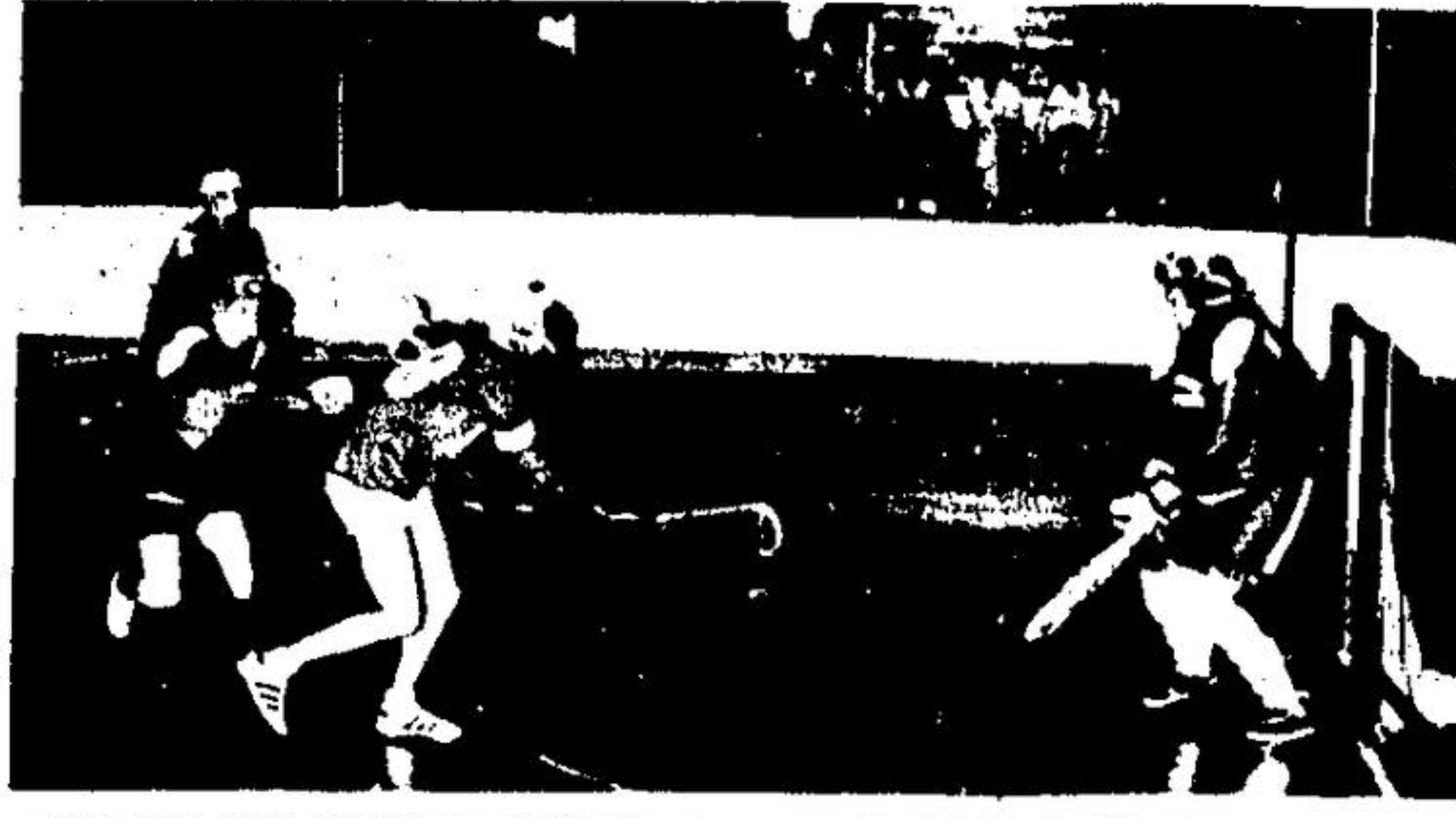
Dunn struck out only four Georgetown batters. He issued just one walk.

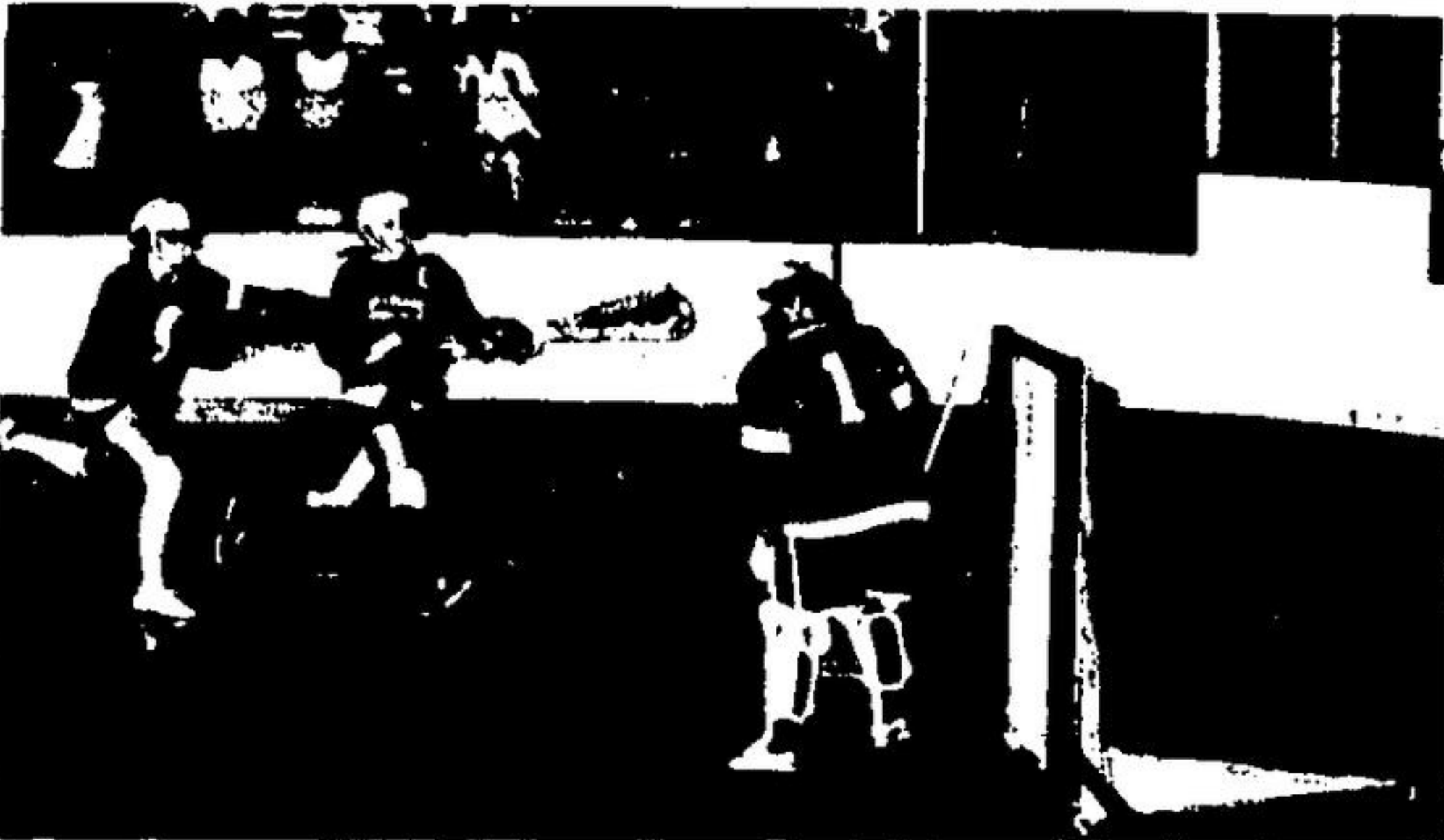

# Roadrunners stymied by ace hurler Young

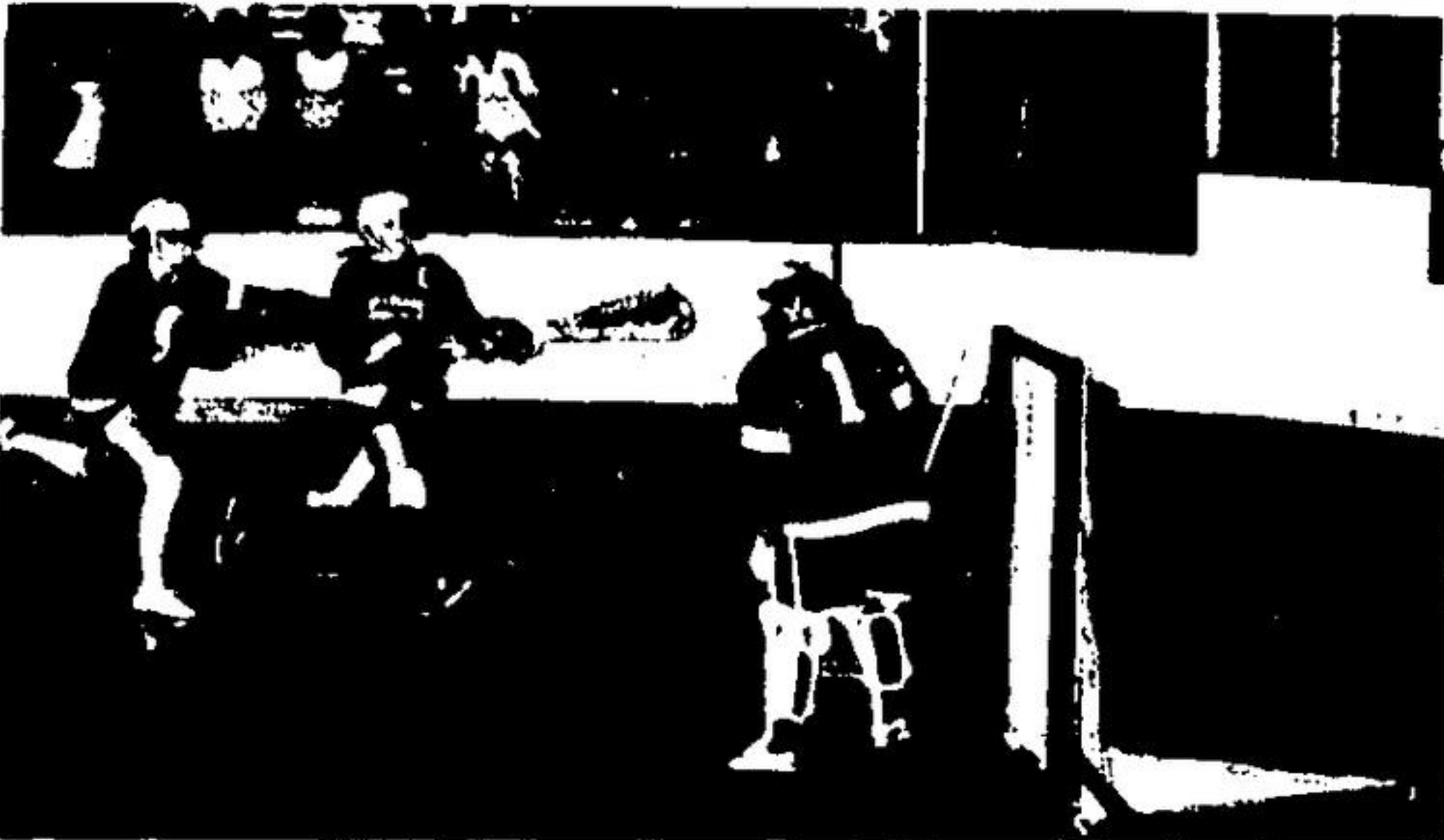

Jim Thatcher and Norm Beattie also robbed the all-stars of base hits with spectacular catches.

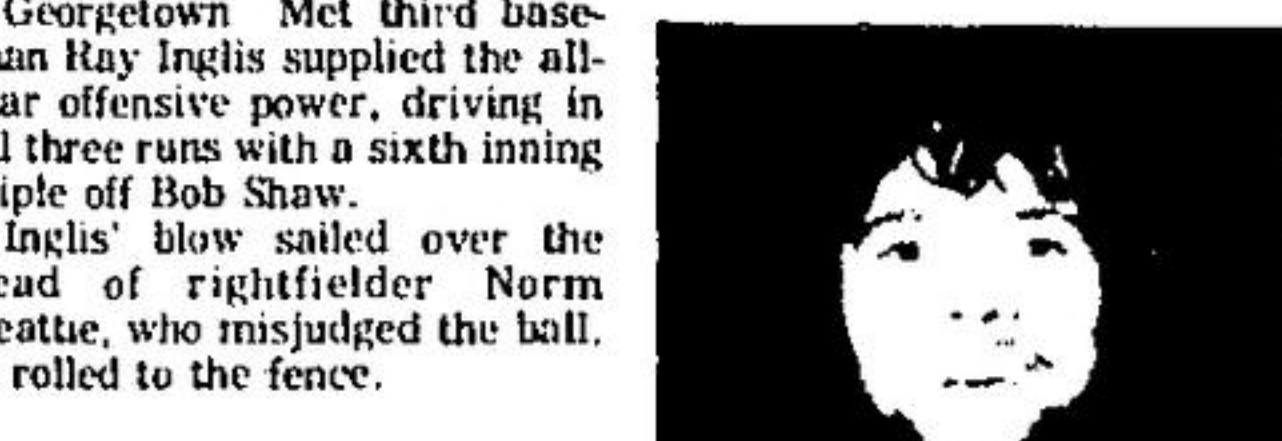
**Neu winner**
