

Charges laid by Acton O.P.P.

A total of 13 general occurrences and five motor vehicle collisions were investigated by the officers of Acton Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police, during the reporting week of July 9 to July 16.

A local man was charged with theft, after being caught shoplifting. Investigation is being conducted into a report of the theft of gas from parked cars.

There was only one charge laid under the Liquor Control Act. An out of town man was charged with "Having liquor in a place other than residence". The driver of the car in which he was a passenger, became startled after spotting a police cruiser, resulting in an accident and finding of the liquor.

A Rockwood man was charged with "Impaired Driving" after attracting attention by driving erratically.

Fortunately, all five motor vehicle collisions investigated resulted in property damage only. There were three charges laid as a result of the accidents.

Calls special hydro meeting

A special meeting of the hydro commission will be called as soon as Mayor Les Duby returns from holidays. The meeting was requested last Thursday by commissioner Ted Tyler Sr. to discuss salary increases to superintendent Doug Mason, Audrey Urquhart and Marjorie Louttet.

Salary increases had been made at a special meeting June 26 which Mr. Tyler and the mayor had not attended.

Increases made
The salary of Mr. Mason was increased by \$1,400 a year, the salary of Audrey Urquhart by eight percent and the weekly salary of Marjorie Louttet increased by \$22.50.

(The increases are retroactive to January 1. They were made to bring salaries here in line with those in similar nearby towns, and the Acton hydro crew.)

Regular meeting
The regular meeting was held in the hydro office last Thursday evening with all members present except Orville Brown,

who is in hospital. Reeve Oakes was representing the mayor. Chairman McEachern presided. In reply to a question, Reeve Oakes explained the work on Bower Ave. is proceeding and tenders are being called. Superintendent Mason said easements would have to be arranged in connection with the project.

Ted Tyler mentioned seeing signs attached to hydro poles and wondered if the public realize it is against the law to affix signs to hydro or telephone poles, because of possible injury to workmen.

A letter from Building Products asked the commission to lift the main line openers to their plant August 23, to cut off power during the annual electrical substation maintenance. Superintendent Mason explained this cutoff only involves the BP plant.

More information
A newsletter and notification of the Beautiful Acton contest were read to the commission. Commissioner Tyler asked Mrs. Louttet to write asking more information on the contest.

The commission will be installing underground wiring to the new apartments on Ransom St. Superintendent Mason said the line there would have to be rebuilt anyway and underground wiring would only cost a few hundred dollars more.

Two lights
Council had written the commission saying they would pay for two additional street lights if underground wiring was installed.

Partial payments for installation of services were received from Acton Meadows subdivision and the condominiums.

Superintendent Mason reported some wiring services already installed on Churchill Rd. S. before houses were completed had been accidentally torn up by the builders, dug up by hand and most replaced now. The developer is to be billed for the extra work involved.
