

# Barbers hot - 3 wins in four games

Pete's Barber Shoppers are the current rage of the Inter-County Fastball hit parade. The barbers edged the Glen 3-1 last Tuesday, lost a 7-6 squeaker to second place Fergus Wednesday, topped Rockwood 5-2 Thursday and nosed Belwood 2-1 Sunday night for a three win record in their last four games. They've done it with their bats—pounding out 45 hits to the opposition's 27. The wins also say kind things about the barber pitching, shared by fastballers Ed Phillips and Grant Usher. Phillips pitched the 3-1 decision

over the Glen last Tuesday, restricting them to five hits while his mates clambered aboard B. McGowan's offerings for 11. Pete's collected all their runs in the top of the eighth after trailing 1-0 from the fifth. Doug Vickery started the rally off with a single, and Bob Andrews followed with a double. Jim Bullough was forced out at first but backstop Fred Buchanan came through with a double and pitcher Ed Phillips aided his own cause with a single. The Glen garnered their solitary run when Cornfoot

bunted safely and B. Zillo tripled. Bob Andrew and Fred Buchanan led the Acton batters with a three for five and two for three respectively. Start off hot The barbers started off the very next night as if they were going to shell big Carl Leybourne from the mound, but Fergus bounced back to tie the game, and pushing the winning run over in the ninth frame, they tied it in the eighth on a three run, three hit barrage from Grant Usher, who hurled for the barbers.

Acton scored three in the first, a single in the fifth and wound up with two in the sixth. Fergus got one in the first frame, another on Lanktree's homer in the sixth, one in the seventh, three in the eighth and the winner in the bottom of the ninth. Lanktree drove in the winning run with a triple. He was top batsman for the winners with three hits in five trips. Fred Buchanan was again the leading Acton hitter, slugging a double and two singles in four appearances at the plate. Jim Bullough and pitcher Usher each

were two for four. Edge Rockwood Third place Rockwood Seniors could glean only five hits and two runs from Pete's on Thursday under the Rockwood candlesticks while the barbers combed Blake Hind for eight hits and five runs. First sacker John Dunn paced the barber bats with three singles as they scored one in the first, three in the sixth and finished with another in the ninth when catcher Harry Barber dropped the ball at the plate. Third baseman Norm Beattie's homer with Hind on the bases

accounted for both Rockwood runs in the sixth. Ed Phillips pitched the win for the tonsorial artists and barked out a double in the three run sixth to aid his own cause. Centre fielder Dave Hinson doubled and singled for the barbers. Grant Usher's catch of Burnet's fence-busting slam in the fifth was the game's fielding gem. Beattie led the Rockwood hitters with a home run, double and single in four trips to the plate. Come from behind Pete's pushed across three

runs in the sixth and three more in the eighth to edge Belwood 9-8 under the Acton lights Sunday night. Grant Usher's three run homer and a triple from the bat of Ed Phillips were the key blows as the barber trailed 8-3 in early innings. Acton blasted 13 hits including home runs by Fred Buchanan and Usher, and Phillips' triple, leading batters for the barbers. Grant Usher and Ed Phillips pitched the win, restricting the visitors to seven hits, one a home run by Bagnall. Phillips relieved Usher in the top of the fourth with

two out, striking out the final batter. It might have not been so close if the Acton club had not committed some erratic throws, enabling visitors to get on base. However, Phillips cooled them out in the final frames by sending them down in order. Thursday night this week the barbers and Rockwood meet under the Rockwood lights. ## Lights to honor Scotty Patterson

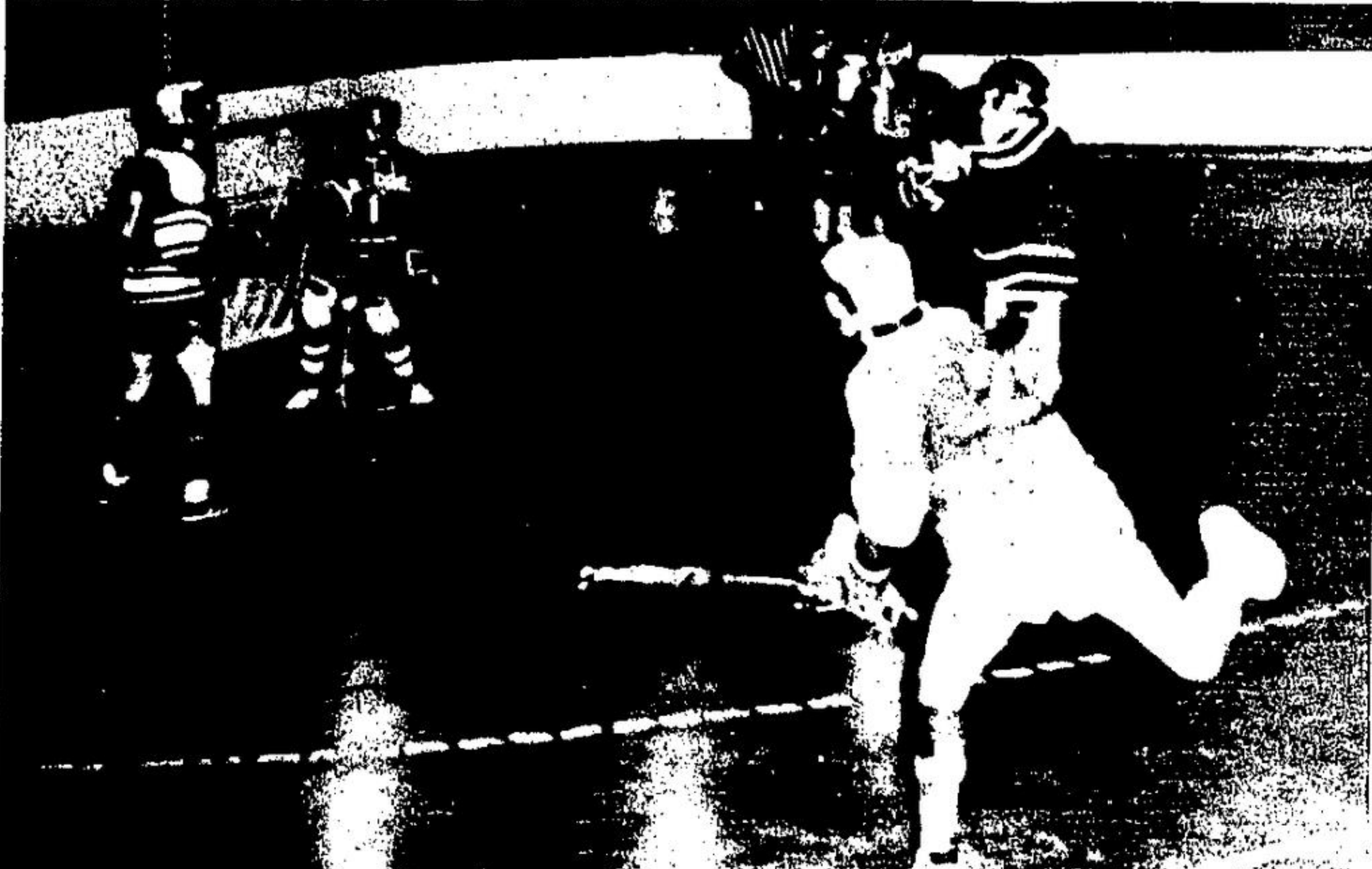
