Film makers shoot Acton

The Construction Safety Association of Ontario filmed a motion picture in Acton over the past week urging correct safety precautions during underground excavations. Called "Hazard Awareness and Hazard Protection", the film urges all construction employees to check for telephone cables, gas lines and old sewers before doing any digging. More important, it tries to convey the proper way of digging and tunnelling to prevent landslides and cave-ins.

The film points out it is management's responsibility to make sure the location is safe. Labour's responsibility is to make sure it is kept safe.

Soil selection
The type of soil in the Acton area was the major reason for the film crew selecting the town as the site of the picture. The Association's Education Department manager, Alexander MacKay, explained that the wet loam common in this area is more likely to cave in than anywhere else. He further explained the use of taking well points which is mentioned throughout the 20 minute film, which is a method of drying moist soil to reduce the chances of it collapsing.

Bill Graham of the Graham Brothers Construction Company, currently developing the land along Wallace St., encouraged Mr. MacKay to come here to shoot the film.

Mr. MacKay said the purpose of the film is to create an attitude of mind, pointing out "if we can save a woman from becoming a widow or a child from becoming an orphan then it's all worth it."

The Construction Safety Association really does worry.

Truck route issue put off by county

Halt County Council will consider alternatives for trucking routes for J. C. Duff and Indusmin Quarries at their August meeting. Residents of Limehouse and 17 Sideroad Esquing have complained often and bitterly about the noise and nuisance trucks have caused passing their homes.

Earlier in the year Halt County Roads Committee rejected a road diversion around Limehouse after holding a public meeting in the hamlet and learning public reaction opposed the diversion. Engineer Jack Corbett was instructed to bring in new proposals for alternate routes. A study done by DeLeuw, Cather

engineers and planners offered a number of alternatives. At the meeting of County Roads Committee Wednesday Esquing Reeve Tom Hill opposed alternatives that suggested coming down the Fourth Line and across 17 Sideroad or down the Fifth Line to 15 Sideroad. He felt the move would only bring about a new series of complaints and would only shift the hardships onto other township residents. The committee made no decision on what route should be used as they deferred the matter until the August meeting when the engineering consultant could be present.

Hill asked engineer Jack Corbett why an all truck route hadn't been considered in the report outlining alternatives. Corbett said his instructions were to find alternatives on existing roads.

Hill has suggested an all truck route will be the only real solution that would free residents of the truck traffic. Hill suggested that if a truck route was provided and people built or bought homes near it it would be their problem. Residents of the Limehouse area and 17 Sideroad appeared at the meeting Wednesday and objected to the truck traffic that passed their home.

Will call tenders on garage

Tenders for a new county works garage for Halt County will be called to fall due Aug. 8 and a public opening will be held the same day at the county administration building.

Engineering consultant Keith Hopper told county council Wednesday of details about the design for the garage. County engineer Jack Corbett told the council septic tank tile bed is being designed and as soon as the design has been approved by the Health Unit arrangements will be made to have a well drilled. The garage is planned to be built in Oakville on Steele's Avenue east of the administration buildings.

Squeezed out
The garage was squeezed out of the 1972 roads budget this year. Plans now are to have the estimate included in the 1973 budget.

It may be possible however that the county will not need the garage if action on the TECO report on regional government is implemented. The report suggests that the county have no works crew and all maintenance and repair work be done by the municipalities and the county only concern themselves with construction of new roads.
