Erin twp. Board needs money to buy land

R. D. Graham, chairman of the cemetery board, appeared before Erin township council at the August meeting with the information that the board needed money to buy property.

Mr. Graham said they had three lots lined up for a price of \$3,500. Funds are also needed for demolishing a stone fence, rebuilding, surveying, cutting elms and bringing in dirt.

He pointed out the cemetery has a relatively small income and that the price of plots in the new section might be increased to keep them in line with other cemeteries in the area.

At present the board hoped for a loan of \$3,000 from both Erin Village and the township.

Reeve Lloyd Lang said council would first have to ask the township solicitor for an interpretation of the Cemetery Act before a decision could be made.

Dogs harry livestock carnage includes goats

July was another month in which livestock injury and death expenses exceeded the from dog licences in Erin township. And the township councillors are concerned. A large part of the \$575 to be paid out will go to Ron Varcoe on the Esqueving Town Line. He lost four of his 53 goats to dogs. Two registered Boxers were seen pulling a fifth goat down but were chased off.

Council agreed that veterinarian expenses for the injured goat should be collected from the dogs' owner. They decided against trying to collect \$160 for the dead goats as the killings were not witnessed. The owner of the dogs will also be notified that under the provincial by-law, any dog seen running loose on property where livestock is kept may be shot.
