

Long Branch PCO's bound for Edmonton

Long Branch PCO's regular season pennant winners in the O.L.A. Junior "C" lacrosse league have earned the right to represent Ontario in the Canadian National Junior lacrosse championships in Edmonton, beginning Saturday, August 20.

PCO's edged Windsor Warlocks 9-8 in the championship game of the O.L.A. tournament at the community centre Sunday afternoon in front of a noisy crowd of over 300 fans, many of them from Long Branch and Windsor.

Acton Rams, dark horses and natural crowd favorites in the four team field bowed 14-10 to Windsor in the tournament opener Saturday morning, in spite of a gutsy team effort and sparkling individual performances by George McPhail and goaltending recruit Mike Kreiner of Oakville.

Long Branch survived a shaky start and bounced back to whip Brockville Magedomas, rugged Eastern Ontario representatives 21-13 in the second semi-final game Saturday afternoon.

Injuries hurt
Rams battled gamely against great odds, after their 90 goal

scoring captain Mike Marcoux and Harry Barrens were forced out of the game by injuries, but the Windsor Club had just a bit too much depth.

Acton jumped into a 5-3 first period lead, fell behind 11-7 in the second stanza, then bounced

right back to within two goals of the Warlocks with just five minutes left in the game.

McPhail assumed the role of team leader and played probably his finest game ever in a Ram uniform, while Warlocks kept a particularly close eye on Marcoux. He scored six of the

Acton goals and hustled from end to end to make key defensive plays.

Goalie hot
Except for a five minute second period stretch when he was beaten four times, Kreiner stood up to some of the hardest Windsor shots of the game, causing

Warlock coach Medo Martinello to shake his head in wonderment. Mike Smith and Dave Forster bagged three goals apiece for Windsor. Ken Rehman scored twice and Fred Rehman, Marty Young, Kim Winger, Larry Howe and Mike Burke tallied and Brian Sangeorzan tallied once each.

Bruce Cooksey with two goals and Mike Marcoux and Craig Weldon with one apiece were the other Acton marksmen. Grant Haines earned three assists, Marcoux collected a pair and Kreiner, Chris Sargent, Brad Timbers and Del Watson added one apiece.

Coach pleased
Rams coach Bruce Sears paid tribute to his inexperienced squad for their efforts.

"We lacked the depth, but we at least forced them to play our type of game. After we got the early lead, they had to come out of their defensive box to get us," Sears said.

Martinello also praised Rams' play.

"That's not the same Acton club we've been playing all year. They're going to be right up there in the playoffs," he predicted.

Martinello denied the Windsor game plan was specifically to keep Marcoux away from the net, but he admitted his club over-shifted to make it more difficult for him to get the ball.

"We knew he had a real hard shot," the Windsor mentor commented. Spectacular first period goaltending by George Oxtoby helped Long Branch grab an early 5-1 lead in the title game Sunday.

Cut lead
Windsor cut the PCO lead to 7-4 at the end of two periods and came within a goal of tying the score, before the 10 minute mark of the third. Merv Maginnis bagged three of

the Long Branch goals. Bob Burwood and Hay Dance each scored twice, Dave Pirog and Morris Masters shot single goals. For Windsor Ken Rehman scored three goals and Fred Rehman, Larry Howe, Mike Smith, Marty Young, and Chris Hymerson netted one apiece.

Acton fans, most of whom favored the Windsor club in the final game booed loudly when Martinello was tossed out of the game for coming on the floor to attend to an injured player in the dying minutes. An O.L.A. rule prohibits coaches from leaving the bench.

Rams past president Howard Dwyer, who handled most of the tournament convening job from the Acton end felt the event was very successful. "I think it did a lot to promote Junior 'C' lacrosse. Every one of the games was exciting. The O.L.A. officials were quite pleased," he reported.

O.L.A. secretary-manager Jack Christie, Junior "C" convenor Al Baxter and executive member Howie Biggar were all in town for the tournament along with O.L.A. referee-in-chief Bruce Hood, an NHL referee during the winter.

Bolton won all four regular season games against the Rams, but all games were close. Wanderers won 15-9 and 17-16, on the community centre floor and 14-12 and 21-16 in Bolton.

Mike Marcoux scoring champ

In spite of a rather disappointing sixth place finish in the O.L.A. Junior "C" league, Acton Rams enjoy the distinction of having the league's first individual scoring champion.

Team captain Mike Marcoux scored 89 goals in the 20 game schedule and assisted on 26 others for 115 points. He won the championship by 12 points over Bolton's Layne Magee.

Ram's Craig Weldon placed ninth in the league scoring race with 78 points, including a total of 54 assists, second highest in the league.

Marcoux beat Bob Turkosz single season Ram goal scoring record by one goal. Turkosz netted 88 goals in 24 regular season Junior "B" league games last year.

Turkocz still holds the team record for total scoring points, 147 and assists, 59 which he also set last year.
