Lace drove in the first two Acton runs with a fourth inning triple and John Dunn doubled home the third in the fifth inning.

Jim Peavoy paced the 16 hit 'Burg attack with three singles. Garnet Rooney singled and tripled and Bob McCulloch singled and doubled.

Bob Andrews led barber shop batsmen with three singles in four trips to the plate.

Sloppy fielding paved the way for all four Belwood runs in the Thursday game. Losing pitcher Grant Usher gave up only seven base hits and recorded three strikeouts. Belwood picked up a single tally in the first inning and three in the third.

Acton runs Barbers scored once in the eighth, when Denis Gibbons reached second on an error and scored on Bob Andrews' Texas leaguer. Fred Buchanan singled and Bill Anderson was safe on an error, as Acton added their final run in the ninth.

Blow lead Indusmins blew a 3-1 lead they held early in the final period, as Oakville peewees stormed back to score four unanswered goals.

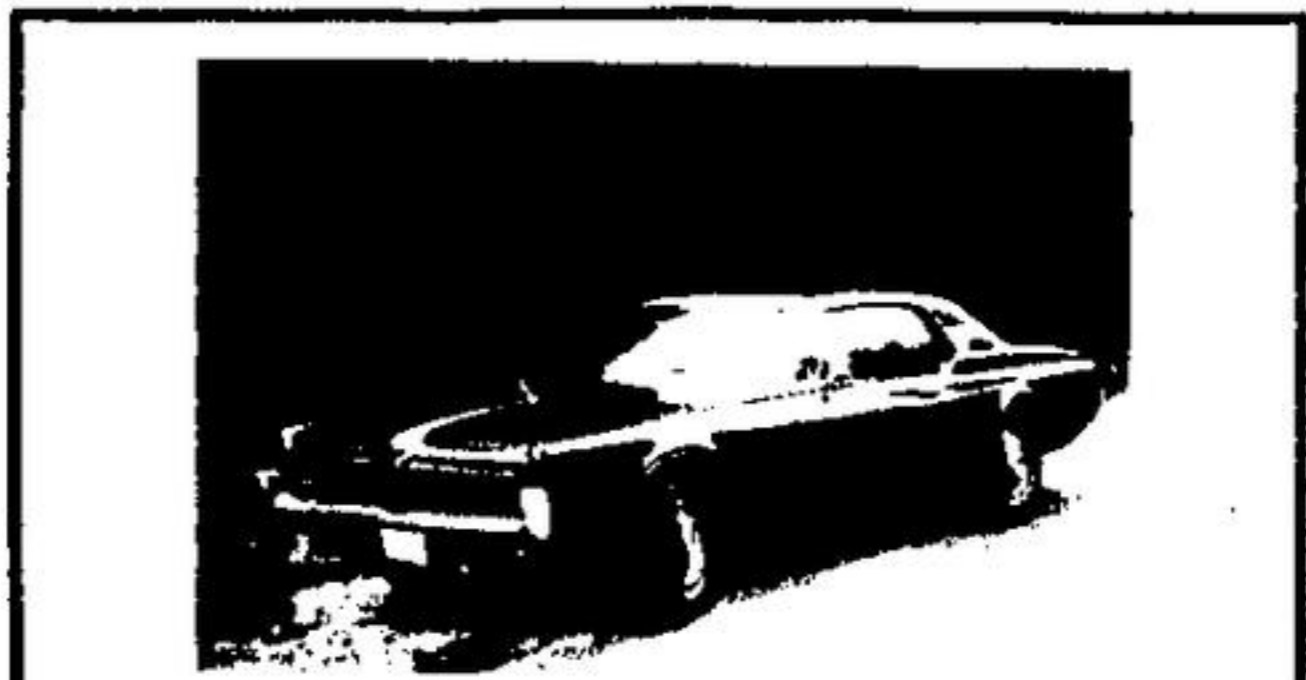
Jan MacDonald had three goals and Derrick Burrows two for the winners.
