

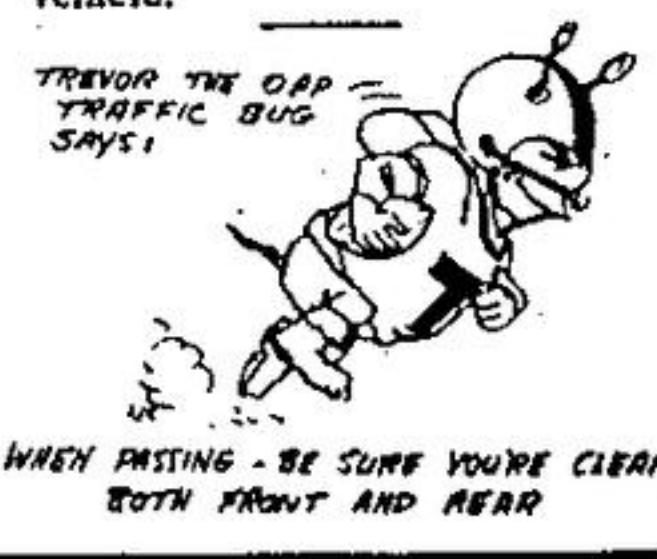
New family, visits here

The Corporation of the Township of Nassagaweya
By-law No. 21-72
Take Notice That:

The Council of the Corporation of the Township of Nassagaweya proposes to pass as a by-law pursuant to section 459 of the municipal act for stopping up and permanently closing the following: Firstly that portion of an unopened road allowance between concessions 5 and 6 thru lots 6, 7, 8, and part of 9, Township of Nassagaweya more particularly described as follows: All in singular that certain parcel or tract of land situated lying and being in the Township of Nassagaweya, County of Halton, Province of Ontario, and being composed of Part of the unopened road allowance between concessions 5 and 6 in the said Township thru lots 6, 7, 8 and part of 9 and which said parcel may be more particularly described as follows: Commencing at a point in the south westerly limits of the said road allowance between concessions 5 and 6, being also the north easterly limit of lots 6, concession 5, distant 17.15 feet measured north westerly there along from the easterly angle of the said lot 6, concession 5, and which said point of commencement is the northerly angle of the lands described in miscellaneous plan No. 120;

THENCE Northwesterly along the Southwesterly limit of the said Road Allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, being also the Northwesterly limit of the said Lot 6, Concession 5, a distance of 1,962.85 feet more or less, to the Northerly angle of the said Lot 6, Concession 5;

THENCE continuing Northwesterly along the Southwesterly limit of the road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and being the Northwesterly limit of Lot 7, Concession 5, a distance of 1,980 feet, or less to the Northerly angle of the said Lot 7;

THENCE continuing Northwesterly along the Southwesterly limit of the road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and being the Northwesterly limit of Lot 8 in Concession 5, a distance of 1,980 feet more or less, to the Northerly angle of the said Lot 8;

THENCE continuing Northwesterly along the Southwesterly limit of the said road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and being the Northwesterly limit of Lot 9 in Concession 5, a distance of 1,430.53 feet to a Standard Iron Bar planted at a point therein;

THENCE Northwesterly at right angles to the Southwesterly limit of the road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, a distance of 86.00 feet to a Standard Iron Bar planted in the Northwesterly limit of the said road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and being also the Southwesterly limit of Lot 9 in Concession 5;

THENCE Southerly therealong a distance of 1,423.27 feet to the Southerly angle of the said Lot 9, Concession 5;

THENCE continuing Southerly along the Northwesterly limit of the said road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and being also the Southwesterly limit of Lot 6, Concession 6, a distance of 1,980.0 feet more or less, to the Southerly angle of the said Lot 6;

THENCE continuing Southerly along the Northwesterly limit of the road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and being also the Southwesterly limit of Lot 7, Concession 6, a distance of 1,980.0 feet, more or less, to the Southerly angle of the said Lot 7;

THENCE continuing Southerly along the Northwesterly limit of the said road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, being also the Southwesterly limit of Lot 6, Concession 6, a distance of 1,962.85 feet more or less to a point distant 17.15 feet measured Northwesterly therealong from the Southerly angle of the said Lot 6, Concession 6;

THENCE Southwesterly a distance of 66 feet, more or less to the point of commencement.

The herein described parcel is subject to a right of way over, along and upon a parcel of land more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at a point in the Southwesterly limit of the Road Allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, distant 17.15 feet measured Northwesterly therealong from the Easterly angle of the said Lot 6, Concession 5;

THENCE Northwesterly along the Southwesterly limit of the road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, being also the Northwesterly limit of Lot 6, Concession 5, a distance of 147.85 feet to a point therein;

THENCE Northwesterly parallel to the Northwesterly limit of the road allowance between Lots 5 and 6, a distance 66 feet, more or less, to a point in the Northwesterly limit of the road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and being also the Southwesterly limit of Lot 6, Concession 5;

THENCE Southerly therealong a distance of 147.85 feet, more or less to a point, distant 17.15 feet measured Northwesterly therealong from the Southerly angle of the said Lot 6, Concession 6;

THENCE Southwesterly parallel to the road allowance between Lots 5 and 6, a distance of 66 feet, more or less, to the point of commencement.

SECONDLY, a 66 foot road established by By-law number 7 in 1881, for the Township of Nassagaweya, through Lots 6, 7 and 8, Concession 5, Township of Nassagaweya, more particularly described as follows: ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land situated lying and being in the Township of Nassagaweya, County of Halton, Province of Ontario, and being composed of Part of Lots 6, 7 and 8 in the 5th Concession of the said Township, and which said parcel is a strip of land having a perpendicular width of 66 feet and lying 33 feet on either side of the herein described centre line.

Commencing at a point in the Southerly limit of the said Lot 6 distant 469.92 feet, (7 chains, 12 links) measured Southwesterly therealong from the Easterly angle of the said Lot 5;

THENCE North 54 degrees, 39 minutes West, 959.64 feet (14 chains, 54 links);

THENCE North 18 degrees, 12 minutes West, 237.60 feet (3 chains, 60 links);

THENCE North 33 degrees, 29 minutes West, a distance of 1,196.58 feet (18 chains, 13 links);

THENCE North 47 degrees, 47 minutes West, 836.88 feet (12 chains, 68 links) to a point in the limit between Lots 7 and 8;

THENCE North 47 degrees, 47 minutes West (South 47 degrees, 47 minutes West in By-law); 33 feet (50 links);

THENCE North 43 degrees, 30 minutes East, (South 43 degrees, 30 minutes East in By-law) 1,189.46 feet (16 chains, 81 links), more or less to a point in the Northwesterly limit of the said Lot 8, being also the Southwesterly limit of the original road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and which point is the end of the said road set out in By-law Number 7.
