throwing her arm around. She first became aware of her It was also discovered that

novice Mac Barr had a fledgling divining power, a fact which delighted him.

The forked metal stick is a bent piece of aluminum, "just something lying around the garage," and is used for defining the width of streams. But the actual power originates with Mrs. Sprowl, herself.

On request, she held both a nati and a pencil over the well site and they behaved in a most peculiar

Fatigue or ill-health affects Mrs. Sprowl's power adversely. If she does a lot of housework on a divining day, she feels tired and drained the next. Fortunately, Mrs. Sprowl is in

excellent health and looks it. Asked what would happen to a vanishing art if she ever retired, Mrs. Sprowl replied that she had been planning on retiring for quite a while but had not been allowed to do so. There's too much demand for

her kind of work.

#### \$45,000 grant Everton dam

The province has announced that a \$45,000 grant to the Grand River Conservation Authority is for the acquisition of lands in the area of the proposed Everton dam and reservoir. Lands in the area are being acquired as they become available on the market. Another \$72,000 grant to the Authority is earmarked for the Luther Marsh Conservation Area. The Authority is proposing to acquire a further parcel of some 887.5 acres in West Luther township, adjoining property previously acquired by the

Authority. The grants were announced through M.P. John Root (Wellington-Dufferin).
