Thefts, four disturbances

During the reporting week of August 20 to August 27 the officers of the Acton Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police, investigated a total of 28 general occurrences and two motor vehicle collisions.

Of the general occurrences investigated there were five reported. disturbances, three liquor law violations, one break and enter and one stolen vehicle. The remainder of the general occurrences were of a minor nature

and required little police action. Of the five reported thefts, three have been brought to successful conclusions. A local man was charged as the result of

an investigation into the theft of gas from parked vehicles. investigation is presently being conducted in regards to a break and enter at a private residence.
