Cairn completed

The cairn at the cemetery has now been completed. It really is a work of art. The stone, of which it is built is a beautiful white marble like rock very specially imported and will retain its beautiful white appearance lastingly.

Mr. Ken Pinkney took great care to design the cairn and we congratulate him on his fine craftsmanship.

In the structure it enclosed the stone block of the former Methodist Church with year 1867, inscribed on the top rests the historic plaque which the Ballinafad Institute had made two years ago. This plaque has an outline of the history of the land on which cemetery, community centre etc. now are — on land first settled in 1820 and donated by that first settler of Erin township, Nathaniel Roszel.

The cemetery presents a fine appearance this Sunday morning Sept. 3, 1972 and we who live at the corner really enjoy its beautiful lawn like appearance, for it had been freshly mowed by Mr. Ken Graham. Those, who have relatives resting there can feel quite complacent about it. Not so many years back it was a jungle of thorn bushes wild

cherry, rocks and weeds. Much hard work and foresight by the trustees and others have been done to make it look as it now is. Work, still is needed. Many of the beautiful old monuments are leaning and need repairs. Also much of the lettering is hard to decipher.
