# Peter Marzo accepts B.U. scholarship

Acton native Pete Marzo, a high scoring winger with Guelph CMC's, the defending Centennial Cup Junior hockey champions, left yesterday (Tuesday) morning for Boston where he will attend Boston University for the next four years on a hockey scholarship.

Boston University Terriers under coach "Snooks" Kelly who recently aligned to coach the New England Whalers of the World Hockey Association have won the NCAA championship, emblematic of U.S. college hockey supremacy three years in succession. During the championship years Canadian born players have made up most of the team.

Pete will enroll in the business administration course and will likely play with the university's freshman team the first year. This will enable him to play NCAA hockey with the varsity team in his remaining three years.

Canadians already enrolled at Boston University include Dick Hadfield, younger brother of New York Ranger captain Vic Hadfield and Dick DeLoe and Bill Patey graduates of the powerful Dixie Beehive Junior "B" team. Pat Devlin of Milton who played goal for the Beehives last year also accepted a B.U. scholarship.

Hockey Association, Marzo played one year of Junior "B" hockey in Guelph and one year with the Kitchener Rangers of the O.H.A. Junior "A" Major league, before moving back to Guelph last season.

In order to accept the scholarship offer, Pete passed up invitations to three professional training camps. Atlanta Chiefs, one of the NHL's two most recent expansion teams, Baltimore Clippers of the American League and Dallas Black Hawks of the CPHL, all were interested in having him attend training camp.
